Learned counsel for the applicant submits that even in the year 2009 the Collector, Jalgaon has initiated the second departmental enquiry illegally 15.12.2009 and withheld one increment of the applicant for the period of one year. The applicant has challenged the said order dated 15.12.2009 Collector, passed Jalgaon by filing administrative appeal, however, it was dismissed on 21.06.2013.
- 6. The applicant came to be retired on 31.10.2011. In terms of the Rule 72 of the Maharashtra Civil Services (General Condition of Services) Rules 1981, the applicant was not paid the retiral payments and as such, the applicant is

2. The applicant had applied for the post of Senior Clerk in pursuance of the advertisement No. 02/2022 published on 16.02.2023. The applicant claims to be belonging to OBC Category and also claims to be a disabled candidate. Total 270 posts are advertised of the Senior Clerk out of which 48 posts are reserved for OBC and out of that 06 posts are reserved for disabled OBC candidates. applicant appeared for the written examination and has secured 136 marks out of 200. He was also called for document verification, however, after verification of the documents his name has been included in the list of not eligible candidates. The shown in the remark column reason as demonstrates that the applicant is not holding the

requisite qualification as prescribed in the advertisement.

- 3. Learned counsel submitted that the applicant is possessing degree of B.E. (Computer) and has also passed MS-CIT examination. Applicant possesses certificates of Marathi & English Typewriting having speed of 30 wpm & 40 wpm respectively. The applicant also possesses the requisite experience as prescribed in the advertisement. Learned counsel submitted that, though, the applicant is eligible and holds the requisite qualification, he has been declared ineligible.
- 4. Learned counsel further submitted that the recruitment process is in progress and within few days the respondents are likely to issue the appointment orders to the candidates, who are eligible and fall in the order of merit. Learned counsel, in the circumstances, has prayed for interim relief, thereby directing the respondents to provisionally include the name of the applicant in the list of eligible candidates and to consider him for appointment on the post of Senior Clerk. In the alternative it is prayed that the respondents be

directed to keep one post vacant of the Senior Clerk from OBC Handicap category.

- 5. Shri V.R. Bhumkar, learned Presenting Officer appearing for the respondent authorities brought to our notice that the candidate concerned is expected to possess the Bachelor's degree in any faculty of Arts or Commerce or Science or Law from a recognized institution approved by the statutory University or any other equivalent qualification declared by the Government in that behalf. Learned P.O. submits that the qualification which the applicant is possessing does not satisfy the criteria prescribed in the advertisement and, as such, the respondents have rightly held the applicant to be not eligible for want of requisite qualification. Learned P.O. in the circumstances prayed for rejecting the request of interim relief made by the applicant.
- 6. We have duly considered the submissions made on behalf of the applicant, as well as, the State authorities. It is true that in the qualification prescribed in the advertisement, there is no express

mention of the degree in Engineering as requisite qualification, however, it has been argued by the learned counsel appearing for the applicant that the degree of B.E. (Computer) is equivalent to the degree He further submitted that Science is a in Science. broad field and the degree of Engineering falls within its swipe and, therefore, cannot be kept out of consideration. We substance see in the The submissions made by the learned counsel. issue so raised is worth considering. circumstances, we find that the applicant has made out a prima facie case for grant of interim relief. We are, therefore, inclined to pass the following order: -

- 2. By this application the applicants are seeking condonation of delay caused in filing the accompanying Original Application.
- 3. There is a delay of 448 days caused in filing the accompanying Original Application.
- 4. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that the father of the applicant No.1 was working as a Police Constable in the office of District Superintendent of Police, Head Quarters, Jalna. He died on 15.11.2011 while in service. Though the applicant No.2 i.e. the mother of the applicant No.1 has filed an application seeking compassionate appointment on 30.06.2017 it was rejected on the ground that the application was not filed within time and also on the ground of 3rd child. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that the applicant No.1 has attained the age of majority in the year 2019

and she has approached to the department in the year 2021 by filing an application for compassionate appointment. However, by order dated 27.04.2021, the said application came to be rejected mainly on the ground that after attaining the age of majority, the applicant had to file an application within the period of one year.

Learned counsel for the applicants submits that after rejection of the said application by order dated 27.04.2021, the applicant No.2 i.e. the mother of applicant No.1 immediately approached one advocate practicing at Jalna and requested him to file a petition. However due to outbreak of pandemic Covid-19 and consequential announcement of the lockdown in the region and the said lockdown period was extended several times, the applicants could not approach this Tribunal within time. However, thereafter, the applicants have approached this Tribunal by taking legal advice in this regard. There is no inaction on the part of the applicants nor there is intentional and deliberate delay as such. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that the delay may be condoned.

- 6. Learned Presenting Officer for the respondents has strongly resisted the application on the ground that there is an inordinate delay. The mother's application came to be rejected in the year 2017 on the ground of 3rd child born to the deceased employee after the cut-off date and in view of that there was no reason to the applicants to file an application in the year 2021 and to approach this Tribunal by challenging the recent order. Learned P.O. submits that there is no substance in the Misc. Application and the same is liable to be rejected.
- 7. It appears that the applicant No.1 has attained the age of majority in the year 2019. Learned counsel for the applicants pointed out that the applicant No.1 is educated and presently appeared for M.A. 2nd year. The father of the applicant No.1 was died while in service as a Police Constable. It further appears that due to the outbreak of the Covid-19 the pandemic applicant could approach the Tribunal by filing the Original Application within prescribed period. The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Suo Motu Writ Petition (C) No. 3 of 2020 has considered the outbreak of

the pandemic Covid-19 and further lockdown announced in the Country and extension of the lockdown period continued upto the year 2021 and thus directed that the delay if any caused in approaching the Courts/Tribunals or any other forum required to be considered from the date as specified in the said order.

8. Thus considering the same it appears that there is no inaction on the part of the applicants nor there is intentional and deliberate delay on their part. The applicants are prevented from sufficient cause to approach this Tribunal within time. However, the applicants are required to be saddled with costs. I compute the costs of Rs. 500/- (Five Hundred only) on the applicants and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER
