- 1. Heard Shri A.V. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Smt. K.S. Gaikwad, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.
- 2. Learned Advocate for Applicant stated that Applicant who was working on post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies; Igatpuri, District Nashik' has been transferred by 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024 to the 'Vacant Post' of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies (Dairy); District Nanded'.
- Learned Advocate for Applicant stated that Applicant had completed her 'Normal Tenure' of 3 years on the post of 'Assistant Registrar, Co-operative societies, Igatpuri, District Nashik'.
- A. Learned Advocate for Applicant then stated that Respondent No.2 who was working on the post of Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies; Sindhkheda, District Dhule' has been transferred in place of the Applicant by 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024.
- that 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Orders dated 31.01.2024 are in respect of 'Assistant Registrar, Co-operative Societies' both of whom have completed 'Normal Tenure' of 3 years under 'Section 3 (1)' of the 'Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005'. Hence as such there was no urgency to transfer them when exercise

of 'General Transfers: 2024' is also expected to have begun as per 'Time Schedule' given in 'G.A.D. G.R. dated 09.04.2018'.

- 6. Learned Advocate for Applicant then emphasized that 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024 makes no mention about provisions of 'Section 4(4)(2)' and 'Section 4(5)' which necessitates 'Special Reasons' and 'Exceptional Circumstances' to be recorded by 'Competent Transferring Authority' and next 'Superior Transferring Authority'.
- 7. Learned Advocate for Applicant thereafter explained about the reasons behind 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024 by stating that Applicant has been suddenly transferred from post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies; Igatpuri, District Nashik' only because of compliant made against Applicant by local 'M.L.A.' on 11.10.2023 to 'Additional Chief Secretary, 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' which in turn came to be forwarded for enquiry to 'Registrar of Co-operative Societies and Co-operation Commissioner, Maharashtra State, Pune'.
- 8. Learned Advocate for Applicant contends that 'Assistant Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Nashik' was tasked to conduct enquiry about the complaint made against Applicant by local 'M.L.A.' and she submitted report on 26.12.2023 to 'District Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Nashik'. Subsequently the 'District Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Nashik' submitted his report of 'Divisional Joint Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Nashik on 19.01.2024.
- 9. Learned Advocate for Applicant also relied on the Judgment passed in 'O.A. No.980/2010' on 22.11.2010 which was subsequently upheld Order dated 17.01.2011 in 'Writ Petition No.9873/2010' by 'Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Bombay'.
- 10. Learned Advocate for Applicant lastly stated that it was pertinent to note that 'Husband' was employee

of 'Central Government' serving on 'Non Transferable Post' in the 'Indian Security Press' at 'Nashik'.

- Learned P.O. states that the transfer of Applicant to the post of 'Assistant Registrar, Copperative Societies (Dairy); District Nanded' has been effected because she had completed 'Normal Tenure' of '3 years' on the post of 'Assistant Registrar, Copperative Societies, Igatpuri; District Nashik' and against the backdrop of many 'Vacant Post' in Nanded District. However she fairly admits based on 'File Notings' and 'Minutes of Meeting' of 'C.S.B.' that there was no specific proposal to transfer Applicant to Vacant Post' of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies (Dairy); District Nanded'. She added that 'C.S.B.' nonetheless had made recommendation for transfer of 'Respondent No.2' to post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies, Igatpuri; District Nashik' as per request made by local 'M.L.A.'.
- 12. Learned P.O. emphasizes that approval of Competent Transferring Authority' and next 'Superior Transferring Authority' were obtained for transfer of both 'Applicant' and 'Respondent No.2' as required under 'Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005'. Thereafter, the Applicant came to be transferred on the 'Vacant Post' of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies (Dairy); District Nanded'.
- 13. Learned P.O. then states that Respondent No.2 has also taken charge of the post of 'Assistant Registrar, Co-operative Societies, Igatpuri; District Nashik' on 01.02.2024 as per 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024.
- 14. The Applicant has been transferred to 'Vacant Post' of 'Assistant Registrar, Co-operative Societies (Dairy), District Nanded' in consideration of the fact

that there were large numbers of 'Vacant Posts' in 'Nanded District'. However, facts remain that name of Applicant was not even recommended by 'C.S.B.' which held its meeting on 29.12.2023 although it did consider the request made by local 'M.L.A.' on 11.10.2023 for transfer of 'Respondent No.2' to post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies, Igatpuri; District Material to note here it is that only on the basis of request made by local 'M.L.A.' to Respondent No.2 was posted in place of Applicant inspite of there the fact that no specific recommendation had been made by 'C.S.B.' for transfer of Applicant of 'C.S.B.'. Hence, undoubtedly 'Respondent No.2' came to be transferred to post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies, Igatpuri; District Nashik' only after it was made available for him by transferring Applicant to 'Vacant Post' of 'Assistant Registrar, Co-operative Societies (Dairy), District Nanded'. The 'Transfer Order' dated 31.01.2024 of Applicant is therefore issued without observing provisions of law under 'Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005' read with guidelines in 'Para 7' of G.A.D. Circular dated 11.02.2015 and principles laid down by 'Hon'ble Supreme Court' in the landmark Judgment of (2013) 15 SCC 732 (T.S.R. Subramanian and Ors. Vs. Union of India & Ors.).

- 15. The 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Order dated 31.01.2024 of Respondent No.2 was hastily brought into effect as he was made to immediately join on the post of Applicant on 01.02.2024 in contravention of 'Rule 29' & 'Rule 31' of 'Maharashtra Civil Services (General Conditions of Service) Rules, 1981' which prescribes the procedures to be observed while taking over of charge by relieving 'Government Servant'; the expected role of relieved 'Government Servant' and importantly supervisory oversight in required exceptional circumstances where 'ex-parte' charge is to be taken releiving 'Government Servants' after prior permission of 'Contempt Authority'.
- 16. The 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' Orders dated 31.01.2024 in respect of the

Applicant and Respondent No.2 have been issued without reference to 'Statutory Powers' under Section (4)(ii) and Section 4(5) of 'Maharashtra Government ervants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005'. The xistence of 'Special Reasons' or 'Exceptional tircumstances' have not been recorded by 'Competent' ransferring Authority' and next 'Superior Transferring Authority'. Also the guidelines in G.A.D. Circular dated 1.02.2015 were side stepped by 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department'. Further, the provisions of 'Rule 29' & 'Rule 31' of 'Maharashtra Civil Services (General Conditions of Service) Rules, 1981' vere overlooked by the 'District Deputy Registrar of to-operative Societies, Nashik'. Hence taking into account the facts and circumstances it would be mperative to grant 'Status Qua Ante' in favour of applicant permitting her to forthwith join back on arlier post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies, Igatpuri; District Nashik'.

- 7. The 'Co-operation, Marketing and Textile Department' during the 'Interim Period' may transfer Respondent No.2 to any other post or allow him to also join back on his earlier post of 'Assistant Registrar Co-operative Societies; Sindhkheda, District Dhule' till such time both Applicant and Respondent No.2 who have done 'Normal Tenures' of '3 Years' as is admissible under 'Section 3(1)' of 'Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005' are required to be transferred during 'General Transfer: 2024'.
- 18. The office objections, if any, are to be removed and court fees to be paid, if not already paid.
- 19. Issue notice before admission returnable on 21.02.2024.

#### Tribunal's orders

- 20. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondent intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A. Private service is allowed. Respondents are put to notice that the case may be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 21. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 22. By Hand delivery, speed post, courier notice to be served and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.
- 23. In case notice is not collected within <u>seven</u> days or service report on affidavit is not filed <u>three</u> days before returnable date, the Original / Miscellaneous Applications shall be placed on board before the concerned Benches under the caption "<u>for Dismissal</u>" and thereafter on the subsequent date the Original / Miscellaneous Applications shall stand dismissed.

- The applicants pray by way of interim relief that the Respondents be directed to issue order of completion of the probation period in favour of the applicants.'
- Pursuant to our orders dated 29.1.2023, Shri Anoop kumar Yadav, Principal Secretary, Women and Child Welfare Department, was present through Video Conference. The bench posed questions to the Principal Secretary as to when the probation period of the applicants working as Protection Officer (Jr) Class-C from 2015 will be treated as completed.
- Principal Secretary, Women and Child Development Department referred to the Protection Officer (Junior) Group-C in the establishment of a Commissionerate of Women and Child Development (Recruitment) Rules, 2014 dated 3.1.2015. He specifically referred to clause 4 & 5 of the said Rules, which is reproduced below:-
  - A person appointed to the post shall be required to pass the Departmental Examination and Examination in Hindi and Marathi language according to the rules made in that behalf, if he has not already passed, or has not been exempted from passing this examination.
  - A person appointed to the post of Protection Officer (Junior), Group-C, shall be on probation for a period of 1 year. Probation period may be extended for a period not exceed 1 year. The person appointed to this post shall complete the probation period satisfactorily. If he/she fails to complete the probation satisfactorily or fails to pass Departmental Examination, if he/she is not

found suitable for the post, then he/she shall be liable for termination from the service."

- The Principal Secretary, has submitted that the probation period of the Protection Officers in the other Divisions, except Konkan Division have been regularized. However, the Deputy Commissioner, Konkan Division has posed a query regarding the probation period to the Commissioner, Women & Child Development Department, who in turn has referred the matter to the Government for its opinion. The Principal Secretary, pointed out that the department is now in the process of conducting the Departmental Examination. However, there has been a stay granted by the M.A.T, Nagpur Bench by order dated 11.1.2024 in O.A 13/2024.
- We find that there has been an inordinate delay in conducting the departmental examination as stipulated in clause 4 of the Recruitment Rules dated 3.1.2015.
- In view of the above, we direct the Respondents to regularize the services of the applicants working as Protection Officers from the Konkan Division, within a period of three weeks from the date of this order. The regularization will be subject to passing of the Departmental Examination.
- 8. Learned C.P.O is directed to file affidavit in reply.
- 9. S.O to 1.3.2024.

- 4. The issues which have been raised relate primarily to transfers of 'Police Inspectors' by 'D.G.P. Maharashtra State' Order dated 30.01.2022 against the backdrop of directions in 'Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023'.
- 5. The 'Home Department' had in the meanwhile sought clarifications on 16.01.2024 with regard to directions in 'Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023' from 'Chief Electoral Officer, Maharashtra State'. Subsequently appropriate clarifications came to be issued by 'Election Commission of India' letter dated

19.01.2024 to 'Chief Electoral Officer, Maharashtra State' in the context of the earlier letter of 'Deputy Secretary' & 'Joint Chief Electoral Officer, Maharashtra State, Mumbai' dated 09.01.2024 in which separate 'Annexure' was attached to indicate the directions in 'Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023' and presumptions made by office of 'D.G.P. Maharashtra State, Mumbai'. In this 'Annexure' at 'Serial No.5' the presumption made by office of 'D.G.P. Maharashtra State' was as to whether directions with regard to period of posting of 'Three Years' out of last 'Four Years' were also applicable to 'Police Officers' posted in 'Specialized Agencies' such as 'State Intelligence Department, Crime Intelligence Department, Anti-Terrorist Squad, Protection of Civil Rights, Police Training Centres, Highway Safety Patrols etc.' The presumption at 'Sr. No.5' made by the office of 'D.G.P. Maharashtra State' therefore was about the extent of interpretation to be made about the phrase 'Functional Departments' used in the context of 'Computerization, Special Branch Training' etc. in 'Para 5.3' of 'Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023'.

- 6.
