#### ORDER

- 1. Heard Shri A.V. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Shri A.J. Chougule, learned Presenting Officer on the point of interim stay to the suspension order dated 20.04.2021 sought by the Applicant.
- 2. The Applicant is working as Deputy Registrar, Cooperative Societies. The Respondent Government by order dated 20.04.2021 suspended the Applicant invoking Rule 4(1)(c) of Maharashtra Civil Services (Discipline & Appeal) Rules, 1979 (hereinafter referred to as 'Rules of 1979' for brevity) stating that offence under Section 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 vide Crime No.17/2021 has been registered against the Applicant for demanding bribe of Rs.1 Lakh.
- 3. In the present O.A, the Applicant has challenged the suspension order dated 20.04.2021 *inter-alia* contending that suspension order is



illegal since the Applicant had passed order exercising quasi-judicial powers as Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies and prior approval of State Government is required for conducting an enquiry or investigation into an offence allegedly committed by him.

- 4. Shri Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant submits that the Applicant has passed quasi-judicial order on 18.02.2021 in favour of complainant viz. Shri Eliha Paul Mrutunjay Panja, and therefore, the question of any demand of bribe subsequent to passing of order did not survive. Secondly, the investigation or enquiry into any offence committed by a public servant while discharging public duties is barred in view of Section 17-A which has been introduced by way of Amendment Act, 2018. He, therefore, submits that since the very foundation of registration of offence under Prevention of Corruption Act is illegal and the suspension based upon it is untenable in law, prayed for interim stay to the suspension order.
- 5. Per contra, Shri A.J. Chougule, learned Presenting Officer sought to justify the suspension of the Applicant inter-alia contending that it is based upon registration of crime under Section 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and Applicant is rightly suspended under Rule 4(1)(c) of 'Rules of 1979' which *inter-alia* provides for suspension of a Government servant where offence has been registered against him.
- 6. The perusal of record reveals that complainant Shri Eliha Paul M. Panja had applied for issuance of orders of Membership in The Malad Samir Co-op.Hsg.Soc.Ltd.' In the said dispute, the Applicant while deciding Appeal No.27/2020 passed order on 18.02.2021 thereby giving direction to admit the complainant as a member of Cooperative Housing Society.
- 7. Now coming to the FIR, the perusal of complaint filed by complainant Eliha M. Paul Panja [Page No.28] reveals that on 05.03.2021, he again went to the Office of Applicant for getting necessary

orders for the implementation of the order dated 18.02.2021 and that time, the complainant allegedly demanded bribe of Rs.1 Lakh since there was some dispute of maintenance. It appears that some clarificatory orders were required in pursuance of order passed by the Applicant on 18.02.2021, and therefore, the Applicant approached him on 05.03.2021. The complainant was not ready to pay bribe, and therefore, approached ACB on 08.03.2021. Thereafter, ACB swung in action and with the help of Panchas and Voice-recorder, some conversation was recorded which *prima-facie* make out a case of demand of bribe. Thereafter, trap was laid but not succeeded since there was no acceptance of the bribe.

- 8. It is on the background, the offence under Section 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 has been registered against the Applicant on 19.03.2021. It is in view of this registration of crime, the Applicant has been suspended.
- 9. Interim relief is sought mainly n the ground for contravention of Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 which is as under:
  - **"17A.** Enquiry or Inquiry or investigation of offences relatable to recommendations made or decision taken by public servant in discharge of official duties.- No police officer shall conduct any enquiry or inquiry or investigation into any offence allegedly to have been committed by a public servant under this Act, where the alleged offence is relatable to any recommendation made or decision taken by such public servant in discharge of his official functions or duties, without the previous approval—
  - (a) in the case of a person who is or was employed, at the time when the offence was alleged to have been committed, in connection with the affairs of the Union, of that Government;
  - (b) in the case of a person who is or was employed, at the time when the offence was alleged to have been committed, in connection with the affairs of a State, of that Government;
  - (c) in the case of any other person, of the authority competent to remove him from his office, at the time when the offence was alleged to have been committed:

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Provided that no such approval shall be necessary for cases involving arrest of a person on the spot on the charge of accepting or attempting to accept any undue advantage for himself or for any other person:

Provided further that the concerned authority shall convey its decision under this section within a period of three months, which may, for reasons to be recorded in writing by such authority, be extended by a further period of one month."

- 10. True, as per Section 17-A(b) of Prevention of Corruption Act, no Police Officer shall conduct any enquiry or investigation into any offence alleged to have been committed by public servant in discharge of his official functions without previous approval of competent authority. In the present case, the competent authority is State Government.
- 11. In the first place, the protection under Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 is available where the alleged offence is relatable to any recommendation made or decision taken by such public servant discharge of his official functions or duties. In the present case, what constitute the offence is alleged demand of bribe and such act of demanding bribe cannot be said relatable to his functions as public servant. Therefore, in my considered opinion, 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act is not applicable to the facts and circumstances of the matter.
- 12. Even assuming for a moment that approval of competent authority as contemplated under Section 17-A(b) is required, it is hardly of any assistance to the Applicant to seek stay to the suspension order. The bar is for conducting an enquiry or investigation without previous approval of State Government and there is no bar for registration of crime. The investigation commences with the registration of FIR. As such, the approval is required for carrying investigation and there is no such specific bar for registration of crime. Therefore, the submission advanced by the learned Advocate for the Applicant that for want of

approval as contemplated under Section 17-A, the registration of FIR is illegal is misconceived and not acceptable.

- 13. It is not clear what is the exact status of the crime registered against the Applicant. It may be that ACB is under process to seek approval in compliance of Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 to proceed with further investigation.
- 14. Apart, the suspension order is issued in view of registration of offence under the provisions of Prevention of Corruption Act. Admittedly, offence under Section 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered against the Applicant on the complaint lodged by the complainant and verified by ACB.
- 15. This being the position, what would be the implication of non-approval of Government and its effect on legality of trial for offence needs to be determined by the competent authority at appropriate level. At any rate, this is not forum to make any comment about breach of Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988. It may affect the legality or trial, if investigation is carried out and charge-sheet is filed without any such approval. However, in so far as suspension order is concerned, it is based on registration of crime under the provisions of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988.
- 16. True, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Yashwant Sinha & Ors. Vs. Central Bureau of Investigation [2020] 2 SCC 338 has highlighted the importance of requirement of approval of competent authority as contemplated under Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988. In that matter, the Petition was filed for enquiry into offences under the Prevention of Corruption Act without obtaining prior approval of competent authority at the stage of non-registration of FIR. Whereas, in the present case, the ACB has already registered the FIR and it is on the basis of registration of FIR, the Applicant has been suspended invoking Rule 4(1)(c) of 'Rules of 1979'.

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- 17. Needless to mention that, parameters required to be borne in mind by the authority for suspension and for initiating criminal action are different. The ACB prima-facie found sufficient material for registration of offence in view of conversation of the Applicant and complainant indicating demand of bribe by the Applicant. As such, the objection for want of prior approval of competent authority under Section 17-A of Prevention of Corruption Act is premature. In view of registration of crime, there was sufficient material before the competent authority to suspend the Applicant and accordingly, the Applicant came to be suspended.
- 18. Thus, in the present scenario, the Tribunal should not stay the suspension order, otherwise it would send wrong signals and it would be detrimental and have deleterious effect on public administration.
- 19. For the aforesaid reason, the prayer for stay to suspension order has to be rejected. Accordingly, interim relief is rejected.
