- In this matter, the applicant, working as Assistant challenges his seniority dated 14.12.2005. counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant was appointed on 10.9.1969 as a Clerk. He belongs to Vanjari community, which was earlier declared as O.B.C. However, in 1996, Vanjari caste community was put into Nomadic Tribes-D. He has produced the Caste Validity Certificate in 2000. In the seniority list published in 2004/2005 the name of the applicant has not been shown. Learned counsel further submits that though seniority list was to be published by G.A.D on 2.2.2001, however, Revenue & Forest Department, without authority published provisional seniority list of Assistant and date of entry into cadre is shown as 1.1.1994 as against 1.1.1992. Learned counsel submits that therefore he has challenged the said seniority list.
- 3. Learned C.P.O relying on the affidavit in reply dated 21.3.2007 filed by K.S Parab, Desk Officer, Revenue and Forest Department submitted that the seniority list was correctly prepared. The applicant was promoted to the post of Assistant and while preparing the seniority his cadre is maintained. However, the persons are promoted from the promotional quota. Learned C.P.O submits that the ratio for fixing seniority in the cadre of Assistant is 40:30:30 and accordingly the applicant has been shown at serial no. 158 and given date of seniority as 1.1.1994 instead 1.1.1992. Learned C.P.O submits that the seniority list is prepared by following the rules and procedure laid down under the law. Hence the petition has no merits.
- 4. In view of the submission made by learned counsel for both the sides and the affidavit in reply filed by the Respondents, we find there is no merit in the application. Hence the same is dismissed.

### **ORDER**

- 1. Heard Shri A.V. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Shri Ram Apte Special Counsel with Smt. K.S. Gaikwad, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.
- 2. The Applicant is serving as Deputy Secretary in Mantralaya, Mumbai and by order dated 25.02.2021, he is simply relieved and asked to join General Administrative Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai.
- 3. Learned Advocate for the Applicant submits that the Applicant was transferred as Deputy Secretary in Housing Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai by order dated 23.07.2016, but now by order dated 25.02.2021, he is relieved which amount to transfer. According to him, there is no

mour

compliance of Section 4(4)(ii) or 4(5) of 'Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 (hereinafter referred to as 'Transfer Act 2005' for brevity), he therefore prayed for interim relief.

- 4. Per contra, learned Special Counsel for the Respondent opposed the interim relief contending that the normal tenure of Applicant being in secretariat service, is three years and Applicant had completed four and half years. There is no illegality in relieving the Applicant from Housing Department.
- 5. Learned Special Counsel has tendered the file noting, which shows that file, was placed before the Hon'ble Minister and Hon'ble Chief Minister to relieve the Applicant from Housing Department only on the ground that he had completed four and half years service in Housing Department, there is absolutely no other reasons mentioned in the file.
- 6. Needless to mention that, in terms of section 4(4) of 'Transfer Act 2005', the Government servant shall ordinarily be transferred only once in a year in the months of April or May. Whereas section 4(4)(ii) provides the situation where the Government servant can be transferred at any point of time after completion of normal tenure of three years for special reasons after recording the same in writing with the prior approval of highest authority.
- 7. Whereas, section 4(5) of 'Transfer Act 2005' provides for midtenture transfer after recording special reasons by highest competent transferring authority.

- 8. In the present case, though the Applicant completed three years which is normal tenure in secretariat service, he should have been transferred in the month of April or May. If such employee is transferred other than in April or May, then there has to be compliance of section 4(4)(ii) of 'Transfer Act 2005' which is completely missing. Suffice to say, except completion of tenure, no other reason is forthcoming to relieve him mid-term. The order of leave amounts to transfer in view of wording of order dated 25.02.2021.
- 9. Apart, learned Special Counsel fairly concedes that the matter was not placed before the Civil Service Board for its recommendation, which is mandatory in view of decision of *Hon'ble Supreme Court (2013) 15 SCC 732 (T.S.R. Subramanian and Ors. Vs. Union of India & Ors.)*.
- 10. The submission advanced by Special Counsel that the Applicant having completed normal tenure of three years can be legally transferred at any point of time is misconceived. Indeed, a Circular dated 21.02.2015 issued by G.A.D., clarify that even if Government servant has completed three years, he should not be transferred except other than in April or May. It further provides that if such transfer is necessary, there has to be reasons and prior approval of competent authority.
- 11. Thus, *prima-facie* the impugned order dated 25.02.2021 is unsustainable in law and deserves to be stayed.
- 12. In view of above, interim relief is granted in terms of Clause 10(a) of O.A.
- 13. Issue notice before admission returnable on 15.03.2021.

- 3. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 4. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of Original Application. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 5. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 6. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.
- 7. In case notice is not collected within seven days or service report on affidavit is not filed 3 days before returnable date, Original Application shall stand dismissed without reference to Tribunal and papers be consigned to record.
- 8. In the mean time, Respondents are directed to ensure to release the provisional pension to the Applicant as per his entitlement.
