This application is made seeking condonation of delay of about 10 months and 27 days caused in filing the Original Application under Section 19 of Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985 challenging the impugned order of removal of the applicant from service dated 09.12.2013 (Annexure -4 in the O.A.) as well as communication/order impugned dated 21.09.2018 (Annexure -11) issued by the respondent No.2 refusing to reinstate applicant in service and seeking benefit of exemption from passing departmental

examination like similarly situated 12 other candidates.

2. The applicant was appointed as a Jailor Grade-II (Non Gazetted), Class-'C' employee by the respondent No.1 vide order dated 30.09.2003 and was posted at Aurangabad. Subsequently he was transferred at various places where he worked. As per Rule 3(3) (b) of the Departmental Examination Rules, the applicant ought to have cleared departmental examination within a period of two years from the date of appointment. However due to reasons such as conducting examination beyond stipulated period, advance age, physical restriction of about writing skills, the applicant could not clear the departmental examination. The applicant continued to work

and discharge his duties unblemishly for about 10 years. The applicant however, was removed from service by impugned order dated 09.12.2013 (Annexure-4) without considering detailed reply given by him to show cause notice dated 21.09.2013 served upon him.

3. Being aggrieved by the said impugned order of removal dated 09.12.2013, the applicant filed Original Application No. 20 of 2014 before the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal, Mumbai along with other Original Application No. 21/14 and other such Original Applications filed by the similarly situated candidates. All the Original Applications were dismissed; thereby injustice was caused to the applicant and others.

- 4. The Applicant in Original Application No. 21/2014 namely Ajay Vishwanath Sirekar filed Writ Petition No. 1556/2015. In order dated 31.05.2015 (Annexure -8 collectively) passed in said Writ Petition No. 1556/2015, the Petitioner therein was granted relief against coercive action.
- 5. The applicant also preferred Writ Petition No. 11471/2015. The said Writ Petition is dismissed by order dated 25.07.2017 (part of Annexure -8 collectively in O.A.) allowing the applicant to withdraw the said Writ Petition with liberty to file representation.
- 6. The applicant filed his representation dated 06.08.2018 (Annexure -9). The same is rejected

by impugned order dated 21.09.2018 (Annexure-11) without considering the fact that the situated candidates were granted similarly exemption from passing departmental examination and their services were protected. Only the applicant is not protected though he is similarly situated candidate. In the circumstances, he has filed the present delay condonation application along with the present accompanied Original Application. There is delay. However, the same is not deliberate. In fact applicant had the made another representation dated 26.09.2018 for consideration and reminder dated 18.02.2019. Hence this application.

- 7. Inspite of grant of opportunities, affidavit in reply is not filed on behalf of the respondents.
- 8. We have heard the arguments advanced by Shri R.D. Biradar, learned Advocate for the applicant on one hand and Shri V.R. Bhumkar, learned Presenting Officer representing the respondents on other hand.
- Perusal of the Original Application would 9. show that it is filed on 19.08.2020 along with Thereby the applicant this delay condonation. has challenged his order of removal from service dated 09.12.2013 (Annexure -4) and order/communication dated 21.09.2018 (Annexure -11) rejecting his representation. The applicant has come out with the contention that similarly situated candidates have been granted

relief of reinstatement as well as exemption from departmental examination and has produced on record certain documents. Those documents are required to be considered which can be done at the time of hearing of the Original Application upon registration.

10. Considering the date of impugned order of removal of the applicant from service which is also challenged in the Original Application, there is much more delay. Further it appears that in the past immediately after his removal, the applicant had challenged the said order. Against dismissal of the Original Applicant, he preferred Writ Petition which is disposed of by order dated 25.07.2018 as withdrawn and granting liberty to the applicant to file representation. In the

maintainability circumstances, of Original Application also may arise but that can be considered at the hearing of it. The applicant is out of service. In view of the same, in our considered opinion, this is a fit case to condone the delay by taking liberal view. Refusing to the condone delay is likely to defeat the cause of In view of the same, justice at the threshold. the delay days caused in filing the accompanying Original Application is condoned by imposing moderate costs upon the applicant. We compute the costs of Rs.1,000/- (One Thousand only) on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER

ORDER

This application is made seeking condonation of delay of about 2 years 8 months and 11 days caused in filing the Original Application under Section 19 of Administrative Tribunals Act. 1985 challenging order/communication dated 05.07.2013 (Exh. 'D') issued by the respondent No.1 to respondent No.3 whereby explanation of respondent No.3 is called as to why at it's level the voluntary retirement notice dated 27.05.2012 given by the applicant was not rejected for want of 20 years qualifying service required for seeking voluntary

retirement and also mentioning that the applicant's voluntary retirement cannot be accepted.

2. The applicant submits that he came to know about the said communication/order dated 05.07.2023 (Exh. 'D') only when he visited the office for making enquiry about as to what happened to his voluntary retirement notice dated 27.05.2012. Immediately thereafter, he filed Original Application about on or 14.03.2017. Office objections were raised. For want of removal of office objections, the registration refused by order was dated In between the applicant had 28.04.2017. undergone Bypass Surgery. Therefore, he could not take necessary steps. He preferred Chamber

Appeal seeking to remove office objections which was allowed by office order dated 09.01.2019. Thereafter this delay condonation application is filed on or about 02.02.2019.

- 3. Application is resisted by filing affidavit in reply on behalf of the respondent Nos. 1 to 4 by one Rohidas Vedu Padvi working as In-charge Chief Administrative Officer in the office of Deputy Director of Health Services, Nashik Circle, Nashik. Thereby he denied the adverse contentions raised in the applicant and contended that no sufficient cause is shown for condoning the delay. Hence, applicant is liable to be dismissed.
- 4. We have heard the arguments advanced by Smt. Renuka Ghule, learned Advocate for the

applicant on one hand and Smt. Deepali S.

Deshpande, learned Presenting Officer representing the respondents on other hand.

- 5. After having considered the facts of the case, it is evident that the applicant is challenging the order of refusal of voluntary retirement. The applicant has contended that he has not received any communication as regards his voluntary retirement notice dated 27.05.2012. Upon visit to the office, he came across this impugned communication dated 05.07.2013, wherefrom it get informed that voluntary retirement is refused.
- 6. Even if the contention of the respondents is taken into consideration, the applicant said to have worked regularly from 16.12.1994 and was

in service till he gave notice of voluntary retirement dated 27.05.2012. In view of the same, the case of the applicant requires consideration which is possible only by hearing the Original Application. It cannot be said that there is absolutely no merit in the case pleaded by the applicant in the Original Application.

7. In such circumstances, in our considered opinion, refusing to the condone delay is likely to defeat the cause of justice at the threshold. If the date of filing of Original Application is considered, the delay is in the vicinity of 2 years and 8 months and if the delay condonation application is considered, as of 02.02.2019, it is in the vicinity of 4 years. However, the applicant has pleaded that he has undergone

Bypass Surgery after filing of Original Application. Hence, in our considered opinion, this is a fit case to condone the delay by taking liberal approach and by imposing moderate costs upon the applicant. We compute the costs of Rs.1,000/- (One Thousand only) on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER

The Misc. Application No. 51/2019 is allowed in following terms:-

(A) The delay caused in filing the accompanying O.A. under Section 19 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985 is hereby condoned subject to payment of costs of Rs. 1000/-

The Original Application is filed seeking relief such as promotion to the post of Tahsildar holding that Maharashtra Probationary Naib Tahsildar Departmental Examination Rules, 2000 are not applicable to the applicant as he was absorbed from the post of Small Saving officer from Finance Department to the post of

Naib Tahsildar and seeking exemption from passing such departmental examination as he has completed 50 years of age.

- 5. We have heard the arguments advanced by Shri B.S. Doifode, learned Advocate holding for Shri K.R. Doke, learned Advocate for the applicant on one hand and Smt. M.S. Patni, learned Presenting Officer representing the respondents on other hand.
- 6. From record it appears that some negligence is attributable to the applicant and his Advocate who failed to remain present at the time of hearing of the Original Application. Considering the nature of relief sought for, in our considered opinion, it would be just and proper to give fair opportunity to the applicant to be in the matter by restoring Original Application for hearing by condoning the delay and by taking liberal view and imposing moderate costs upon

the applicant. We compute the costs of Rs.1,000/- (One Thousand only) on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER

- (A) The Misc. Application No. 157/2023 is allowed.

This application is made seeking condonation of delay of about 4 years and 9 months caused in filing the Original Application under Section 19 of Administrative Tribunals seeking relief to consider 1985 Act. the temporary service rendered by the applicant w.e.f. 19.06.1989 to 08.03.1999 as qualifying service for grant of pension and pensionary benefits and all other consequential service benefits.

2. The applicant is retired from service on 30.06.2015 from the office of respondent No.4 on

the post of Accounts Clerk. Pension is granted to the applicant. Thereafter, the Government of Maharashtra issued G.R. dated 07.10.2016, thereby issuing certain guidelines for counting of temporary service for grant of Time Bound Promotion/ Assured Career Progression Scheme to the employees.

3. The Hon'ble Tribunal has been pleased to allow the identical Original Applications filed by his batchmate namely K.G. Ghumre bearing Original Application No. 550/2019 by order dated 23.11.2021. In that regard, news was published in the newspaper. The applicant got knowledge of the said order of the Tribunal in first week of March, 2022. He, thereafter, made representation dated 07.03.2022 to the

respondent No.4 seeking counting of temporary service as qualifying service from the year 1989 to 1999. The said representation is not yet decided. He, therefore, filed the accompanying Original Application along with this delay condonation application. The delay is not deliberate. The applicant is deprived of his legitimate dues towards pension and other service benefits. Hence this application.

- 4. Affidavit in reply is filed on behalf of the respondent Nos. 1 to 4 thereby delay condonation application is resisted contending that sufficient cause is not shown.
- 5. We have heard the arguments advanced by Shri K.B. Jadhav, learned Advocate for the applicant on one hand and Shri D.R. Patil,

The accompanied Original Application is 6. filed on 30.08.2022. The applicant seeks to rely upon the decision of this Tribunal dated 23.11.2021 passed in the Original Application No. 550/2019 filed by the batchmate of the applicant. The applicant retired on 30.06.2015. In between one and half years, some time was consumed in Covid-19 pandemic situation. The delay cannot be said to be deliberate one. Some negligence can be attributed to the applicant in not approaching the Tribunal in time and acting as a fence sitter. However, the said negligence cannot be said to be deliberate or gross one. Hence in our considered opinion, this is a fit

case to condone the delay by taking liberal approach and by imposing moderate costs upon the applicant. We compute the costs of Rs.2,000/- (Two Thousand only) on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

- 2. After issuance of impugned order of dismissal of the applicant dated 20.02.2009, the applicant approached the Labour Court at Nanded by filing complaint (Unfair Labour Practice) bearing No. 52/2009.
