2. When the present matter is taken up for hearing, the learned Presenting Officer submits that the matter is pending with the State Government for taking final decision in the matter of departmental enquiry held against the applicant. The learned Presenting Officer, in the circumstances, has sought time. The request so made is opposed by the learned counsel appearing for the applicant.

3. From the facts, which have come on record, it is discernable that the matter is pending with the State Government since last about 02 years. Learned counsel pointed out that the applicant was due for promotion, however, the respondents did not consider her to be promoted on the ground that the

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departmental enquiry is pending against her. The departmental enquiry was initiated against the applicant in the year 2016. The learned counsel has brought to our notice that in the meanwhile the juniors to the present applicant have got the promotion. The learned counsel further submitted that even otherwise in the enquiry so held, out of 10 charges, 08 charges are held to be not proved and 02 charges, which have held to have been proved, applicant has submitted her the appropriate explanation showing that the said charges cannot be held to have been proved. Because the final decision has not been taken, the applicant is deprived of her further promotion. Learned counsel brought to our notice the Government Resolution dated 15.12.2017, clause 11 thereof, reads thus :-

> "99 विभागीय पदोन्नती समितीच्या पहिल्या बैठकीनंतर दोन वर्षांनी शिस्तभंगविषक/न्यायालयीन कार्यवाहीच्या अंतिम निर्णयाच्या आधिन संबधित अधिकारी/कर्मचा-यास तदर्थ पदोन्नती देणे आवश्यक आहे, असे सक्षम प्राधिका-याचे मत झाल्यास मोहारबंद पाकिट उघडण्यात येव नये. विभागीय पदोन्नती समितीची बैठक बोलावून सबंधित अधिकारी/कर्मचा-याची पात्रता/अपात्रता नव्याने तसासावी. पन्हा नव्याने पात्रता तपासल्यानंतर संबंधीत अधिकारी/कर्मचारी पदोन्नतीसाठी पात्र ठरल्यास. त्यांना ११ महिन्यांसाठी किंवा विभागीय चौकशी/न्यायालयीन कार्यवाही अंतिम होईल यांपैकी जे अगोदर होईल तेवढया कालावधीसाठी खालील अर्टीच्या अधीन राहून निव्वळ तदर्थ पदोन्नती देण्यात यावी. खालील अटी व शर्ती तदर्थ पदोन्नतीच्या आदेशामध्ये सुस्पष्टपणे नमुद कराव्यात :-

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(i) शिस्तभंगविषयक/न्यायालयीन कार्यवाहीच्या अधिन दिली जाणारी तदर्थ पदोन्नती केवळ तात्पुरती असेल व या तदर्थ पदोन्नतीमुळे नियमितपणाचे व ज्येष्ठतेचे कोणतेही लाभ अशा अधिकारी/कर्मचा-यांना मिळणार नाहीत.

(ii) ही तदर्थ पदोन्नती "पुढील आदेशापर्यंत असेल". तसेच कोणत्याही वेळी दिलेली तदर्थ पदोन्नती रददकरून मुळ पदावर पदावनत करण्याचा हक्क शासन राखून ठेवीत आहे."

On perusal of the provision under the aforesaid clause, we are convinced that the said provision would squarely apply in the present matter.

4. In the circumstances, while granting time to the respondents to work out the matter, we deem it appropriate to pass the following order :-

### <u>order</u>

(i) Time as asked for by the respondents is granted.

(ii) The respondents are directed to consider the case of the applicant for granting her provisional promotion as provided in clause 11 of the G.R. dated 15.12.2017 and for that purpose it is further directed that the respondents shall call the meeting of the Departmental Promotion Committee within 02 weeks from the date of this order for the said

purpose and give provisional promotion to the applicant, if she fulfils the conditions as are provided in clause 11 of the G.R. dated 15.12.2017, and on the terms and conditions incorporated in the said G.R.

(iii) S.O. to 20.02.2023.

(iv) Steno copy allowed for the use of learned Presenting Officer.

2. The present Misc. Application has been filed by the applicant for condonation of delay occasioned in filing the accompanying Original Application.

3. appearing The learned counsel for the applicant submits that by filing the accompanying Original Application the applicant has sought quashment of the order dated 1.7.2016 passed by respondent no. 02, whereby open enquiry into the assets of the applicant has been initiated. Since some delay has occurred in filing the accompanying O.A., the applicant has filed the present Misc. Application.

4. Learned counsel submitted that the applicant was advised by his counsel to approach the Hon'ble

High Court. Accordingly the applicant approached the Hon'ble Bombay High Court by filing Writ Petition No. 3812/2016. However, when the said writ petition was taken up for consideration by the Division Bench of Hon'ble High Court on 12.12.2018, the Hon'ble High Court disposed it of by observing that the petitioner has got remedy of Maharashtra Administrative approaching the Tribunal U/s 19 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985 and hence giving liberty to the petitioner to approach the Tribunal by further observing that all the contentions are kept open. Thereafter, on 27.12.2018 i.e. within a week the applicant filed Original Application before the principal seat of this Tribunal at Mumbai and then on the ground of territorial jurisdiction, the applicant was directed to approach this Tribunal and in the month of January, 2019 the applicant has accordingly filed the accompanying O.A. before this Tribunal and thereafter on objection raised by the Registry, also Application filed the present Misc. seeking condonation of delay. Learned counsel submits that if the chronology of the events occurred is seen, the

applicant had diligently approached the Hon'ble High Court and after disposal of Writ Petition, without loss of time, approached this tribunal. Learned counsel submits that the applicant was bona fidely agitating his grievance, but before wrong forum. In such circumstances, delay requires to be condoned.

4. Learned Chief Presenting Officer submitted that preferring writ petition before the Hon'ble High Court was deliberate action on part of the applicant to kill the time; moreover delay has not been appropriately explained by the applicant. He therefore prayed to reject the Misc. Application.

5. We have considered the submissions advanced by the learned counsel appearing for the applicant and the learned Chief Presenting Officer for the respondent authorities. The applicant had approached the Hon'ble High Court by filing writ petition in the year 2016 itself. Vide order passed by the Hon'ble High Court liberty has been granted to the applicant to approach this Tribunal U/s 19 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985. In the

circumstances, it does not appear to us that there is any ground to hold that the applicant had deliberately approached this Tribunal late.

6. Having regard to the facts as aforesaid, we are inclined to condone the delay so that the O.A. can be prosecuted on merits. Hence, the following order:-

(i) Delay occasioned in filing accompanying O.A. is condoned.

(ii) Accompanying Original Application be registered and numbered in accordance with law.

(iii) Misc. Application stands disposed of without any order as to costs.

(iv) Original Application to come up for hearing on 22.2.2024.

(v) Order passed in favour of the applicant on 20.9.2019 to continue till then.

Heard Shri J.S. Deshmukh, learned counsel for the applicants in O.A. Nos. 1012, 1013, 1014 & 1064 all of 2022, Shri K.B. Jadhav, learned counsel for the applicant in O.A. No. 426/2023 and S/shri I.S. Thorat & D.R. Patil, learned Presenting Officer for the respondent authorities in respective O.As.

2. All these matters are taken up for discussion together, since identical issues are involved and decided by this common order finally at the sage of admission, by consent.

The applicants in O.A. Nos.1012, 1013, 1014 &
 1064 all of 2022 are seeking directions to the

decision respondents to take in respect of suspension period as duty period, as well as, seeking directions to the respondents to pay pensionary benefits till decision of criminal appeal against their acquittal by taking appropriate undertaking. The applicants in O.A. Nos. 1014 & 1064 both of 2022 are seeking prayer to quash and set aside the impugned communication dated 29.12.2021 issued by respondent No. 3.

4. So far as Original Application No. 426/2023 is concerned, the applicant is seeking direction to the respondents to pay the regular pension, amount of Commutation, amount of leave encashment and amount of Gratuity / DCRG, as well as, interest on the said amounts. No directions regarding suspension period are sought for the reason that after his acquittal the suspension period was regularized by the respondents.

5. Brief facts giving rise to the Original Applications are as follows :-

### (I) O.A. No. 1012/2022:-

(i) The applicant was appointed as Constable in Police Department in the year 1985.

He retired from the post of Police Head Constable on 31.05.2020 from Police Head Quarters, Jalna. Further on the basis of complaint lodged with A.C.B. against the applicant in respect of demand of bribe of Rs. 500/- from one Samadhan Suradkar and Babita Mhaske, Crime No. II-3015/2012 u/s 7, 13(1)(3)(d) with 13(2) of Prevention of Anticorruption Act, 1988 registered against the applicant on 04.12.2012 at Police Station Tembhurni, Tq. Jafrabad, District Jalna. In view of registration of said crime under the orders of the respondent No. 3, the applicant came to be suspended on 06.12.2012 (Annexure A-2) in terms of Rule 3(1)(A-2)(1-A)(b) of Bombay Police (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1956. After taking periodical review of the suspension, the respondent No. 3 has reinstated the applicant and several others vide order dated 25.02.2016 (Annexure A-3) by revoking their suspension orders, subject to Special Case pending against them before the learned Sessions Court. Thus the applicant joined duties on 26.02.2016.

(ii) It is further case of the applicant that he came to be acquitted in Special Case No. 07/2013

pending against him at Jalna by judgment and order dated 16.05.2019 (Annexure A-4). Being aggrieved by the same, the State has preferred Criminal Appeal against the order of acquittal before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad, however, the same is pending.

(iii) It is the case of the applicant that since the date of retirement i.e. 31.05.2020 he has received only provisional pension w.e.f. 01.06.2020 and no pensionary benefits were paid to him. Though the applicant has made a representation requesting competent authorities to treat his suspension period as duty period and releasing the pensionary benefits subject to decision of Criminal Appeal pending before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad, no effective order has been passed. Through the applicant is receiving provisional since June, 2020, however gratuity, pension D.C.R.G. and other pensionary benefits are yet not paid to the applicant solely on the ground that the Criminal Appeal against his acquittal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court. The applicant has therefore, approached this Tribunal by filing the present Original Application.

#### (II) O.A. No. 1013/2022:-

(i) The applicant was appointed as Constable in Police Department in the year 1986. He retired from the post of Police Head Constable on 31.07.2022 from Police Head Quarter, Jalna. Further on the basis of complaint lodged with A.C.B. against the applicant in respect of demand of bribe of Rs. 2500/- from one Babarao Rathod, Crime No. II-3012/2014 u/s 7, 13(1)(d) with 13(2) of Prevention of Anticorruption Act, 1988 registered against the applicant on 10.07.2014 at Police Station Mantha, Tq. Jafrabad, District Jalna. In view of registration of said crime under the orders of the respondent No. 3, the applicant came to be suspended on 17.07.2014 (Annexure A-2) in terms 3(1)(A-2)(1-A)(1)(b) of Bombay Police of Rule (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1956. After taking periodical review of the suspension, the respondent No. 3 has reinstated the applicant and several others vide order dated 25.02.2016 (Annexure A-3) by revoking their suspension orders subject of Special Case pending against them before the learned Sessions Court. Thus the applicant joined duties on 27.02.2016.

(ii) It is further case of the applicant that he came to be acquitted in Special Case No. 23/2014 pending against him at Jalna by judgment and order dated 22.02.2019 (Annexure A-4). Being aggrieved by the same, the State has preferred Criminal Appeal against the order of acquittal before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad, however, the same is pending.

(iii) It is the case of the applicant that since the date of retirement i.e. 31.07.2022 he has received only provisional pension w.e.f. 01.08.2022 and no pensionary benefits were paid to him. Though the applicant has made a representation requesting competent authorities to treat his suspension period as duty period and releasing the pensionary benefits subject to decision of Criminal Appeal pending before the Hon'ble High Court. Bench at Aurangabad, no effective order has been passed. Through the applicant is receiving provisional pension since August, 2021, however gratuity, D.C.R.G. and other pensionary benefits are yet not paid to the applicant solely on the ground that the

Criminal Appeal against his acquittal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court. The applicant has therefore, approached this Tribunal by filing the present Original Application.

#### (III) O.A. No. 1014/2022:-

applicant The was appointed (i) as Constable in Police Department in the year 1985. He retired from the post of Police Head Constable on 31.05.2020 from Police Station Ashti, Tq. Partur, District Jalna. Further on the basis of complaint lodged with A.C.B. against the applicant in respect of demand of bribe of Rs. 2000/-, Crime No. II-3002/2004 u/s 7, 13(1)(d) with 13(2) of Prevention of Anticorruption Act, 1988 registered against the applicant on 10.01.2004 at Police Station Mantha, Tq. Mantha, District Jalna. In view of registration of said crime under the orders of the respondent No. 3, the applicant came to be suspended on 12.01.2004 (Annexure A-2) in terms of Rule 3(1-A)(1)(b) of Bombay Police (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1956. The applicant was reinstated in service w.e.f. 28.11.2007.

(ii) It is further case of the applicant that he came to be acquitted in Special Case No. 07/2004 pending against him at Jalna by judgment and order dated 27.09.2007. Being aggrieved by the same, the State has preferred Criminal Appeal against the order of acquittal before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad, however, the same is pending.

It is the case of the applicant that since the (iii) date of retirement i.e. 31.05.2020 he has received only provisional pension w.e.f. 01.06.2020 and no pensionary benefits were paid to him. The applicant has made a representation requesting competent authorities to treat his suspension period as duty period and releasing the pensionary benefits subject to decision of Criminal Appeal pending before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad. The respondent No. 3 vide communication dated 29.12.2021 (Annexure A-4) rejected the request of the applicant to treat his suspension period as duty period as the Criminal Appeal is pending against the applicant before the Hon'ble High Court. Through the applicant is receiving provisional pension since

June, 2020, however gratuity, D.C.R.G. and other pensionary benefits are yet not paid to the applicant solely on the ground that the Criminal Appeal against his acquittal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court. #### (IV) O.A. No. 1064/2022:-

(i) The applicant was appointed as Constable in Police Department in the year 1979. He retired from the post of Police Head Constable on 31.10.2013 from Police Station Ashti, Tq. Partur, District Jalna. Further on the basis of complaint lodged with A.C.B. against the applicant in respect of demand of bribe of Rs. 1000/-, Crime No. II-3034/2008 u/s 7, 13(1)(d) with 13(2) of Prevention of Anticorruption Act, 1988 registered against the applicant on 13.06.2008 at Kranti Chowk Police Station, Aurangabad. In view of registration of said crime under the orders of the respondent No. 3, the applicant came to be suspended on 01.07.2008 (Annexure A-2) in terms of Rule 3(1)(A-2)(1-A)(b) of

Bombay Police (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1956. The applicant was reinstated in service w.e.f. 05.10.2010.

(ii) It is further case of the applicant that he came to be acquitted in Special Case No. 22/2008 pending against him at Jalna by judgment and order dated 20.05.2016. Being aggrieved by the same, the State has preferred Criminal Appeal against the order of acquittal before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad, however, the same is pending.

(iii) It is the case of the applicant that since the date of retirement i.e. 31.10.2013 he has received only provisional pension w.e.f. 01.11.2013 and no pensionary benefits were paid to him. The applicant has made a representation requesting competent authorities to treat his suspension period as duty period and releasing the pensionary benefits subject to decision of Criminal Appeal pending before the Hon'ble High Court, Bench at Aurangabad. The respondent No. 3 vide communication dated 29.12.2021 (Annexure A-4) rejected the request of

the applicant to treat his suspension period as duty period as the Criminal Appeal is pending against the applicant before the Hon'ble High Court. Through the applicant is receiving provisional pension since November, 2013, however gratuity, D.C.R.G. and other pensionary benefits are yet not paid to the applicant solely on the ground that the Criminal Appeal against his acquittal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court. The applicant has therefore, approached this Tribunal by filing the present Original Application.

#### (V) O.A. No. 426/2023:-

(i) The applicant was appointed as Police Constable with the respondent No. 2 on 17.02.1978. He retired from the post of A.S.I. on 31.12.2010 from the office of respondent No. 2. On 04.01.2002 crime was registered against the applicant bearing Crime No. 3001/2022 u/s 7, 13(1)(d) read with 13(2) of Prevention of Anticorruption Act, 1988 at Ajintha, District Aurangabad. In view of registration of said crime, the applicant came to be suspended on 11/14.01.2002 (Annexure A-1).

(ii) Meanwhile the charge sheet came to be filed before the Special Court, Aurangabad and same is registered as Special Case No. 11/2002. The applicant acquitted from the said Special Case by judgment and order dated 21.04.2005 (Annexure A-2). In view of acquittal from the Special Case, the applicant was reinstated in service by order dated 25.07.2005 (Annexure A-3) and posted at Police Head Quarter, Aurangabad.

(iii) The applicant came be retired to on 31.12.2010 from the post of A.S.I. from the office of respondent No. 2. After acquittal from the Criminal Case, the applicant was submitted application to the respondents to regularize his suspension period. The respondent No. 2 regularize the suspension period as duty period for all the purposes. In view of regularization of suspension period, the respondent No. 2 revised the pay of the applicant by the order dated 23.09.2022 (Annexure A-6).

(iv) Meanwhile, on 30.04.2005, the State has filedCriminal Appeal No. 673/2005 before the Hon'bleHigh Court challenging the judgment and order

dated 21.04.2005 passed by the Special Court, Aurangabad in Special Case No. 11/2002. The said Criminal Appeal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court.

(v) The applicant has submitted application to the respondent No. 2 thereby requesting to pay him regular pension and other all retirement benefits. The respondent No. 2 paid the monetary benefits of suspension period to him in the month of May, 2023, but the regular pension and other benefits are not paid to him till today. Hence, the present Original Application.

6. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that in a case of Ashfakali Khan Abdulali Khan Vs. The State of Maharashtra and Ors. W.P. No. 6650/2020, decided on 25.10.2021, the Division Bench of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Bench at Aurangabad in the identical facts of case partly allowed the petition with a rider that the petitioner shall tender an affidavit / undertaking to the respondent No. 3 Municipal Commissioner stating therein that if he suffers an adverse order in the

pending proceedings for challenging the acquittal and his acquittal is converted into conviction, he shall return the entire gratuity amount within 8 weeks from such adverse judgment, subject to his right challenge the said judgment. A11 to consequences flowing from such conversion of acquittal into conviction would bind the petitioner to the extent of the monetary reliefs that he would be getting in view of this order. [b] After such affidavit is filed satisfying the above stated ingredients, the Corporation shall initiate steps for compliance of prayer clause "B" and ensure that such compliance is made within 12 (twelve) weeks from the date of the filing of such affidavit by the petitioner.

7. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that in terms of the said order passed by the Division Bench of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Bench at Aurangabad, this Bench of the Tribunal in several O.As. with the identical issue, has adopted the same course of action and disposed of the same.

8. Learned Presenting Officer submits that as per Rule 130 of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Pension)

applicants Rules, 1982, the are entitled for provisional pension only till the disposal of the criminal cases pending against them. The applicants are not entitled for pay and allowances as per Rule 72 of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Joining Time, Foreign Services and Payment During Suspension, Dismissal and Removal) Rules, 1981 (for short 'Rules of 1981') till final disposal of the cases against them. Learned P.O. submits that when the appeal filed by the State against the order of acquittal is pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Bench at Aurangabad, the respondent has rightly rejected the request of the applicants for treating the suspension period etc. as per the rules quoted above. Learned P.O. submits that payment of the gratuity/ D.C.R.G. and other pensionary benefits cannot be made over to the applicants till the cases against them are finally decided in terms of Rule 130 of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1982 and Rule 4 of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Commutation) Rules, 1984. Learned P.O. submits that all these Original Applications are liable to be dismissed with costs.

9. It appears from the documents annexed to all these Original Applications that though crime under provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act came to be registered against the applicant/s, he/ they came to be acquitted by the Sessions Court and at present only appeal against the acquittal preferred by the State is pending against him/them before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Bench at Aurangabad.

10. In a case of **Ashfakali Khan Abdulali Khan** (cited supra) with the identical state of facts, the Hon'ble Division Bench by order dated 25.10.2021 has partly allowed the W.P. in terms of prayer clause-B with the rider. In para Nos. 3, 4 & 5, the Division Bench of Hon'ble High Court of Bombay, Bench at Aurangabad has made following observations :-

"3. It is settled Law that gratuity cannot be forfeited unless the offence amounting to moral turpitude is proved to have been committed by the petitioner, u/s 4, 6(d)(2) of the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 and in the light of the judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Apex Court in the matter of <u>Union</u> <u>Bank of India and others Vs. C.G.Ajay Babu and</u> another [(2018) 9 SCC 529].

4. The learned Advocate for the Corporation submits that the provisional pension is being granted to the petitioner. He, however, cannot point out any provision under the MCS (Pension) Rules, 1982 that an appeal pending against acquittal would empower the employer to hold back regular pension.

5. In the light of the facts as recorded above and keeping in view that an appeal against the acquittal is pending adjudication, the petitioner need not be made to suffer the rigours of litigation, though, we intend to pass an equitable order."

In view of above observations, the Division Bench has partly allowed the aforesaid Writ Petition and in terms of para No. 6, has passed the following order with rider :-

"6. In view of the above, this petition is partly allowed in terms of prayer clause "B" with the following rider :-

[a] The petitioner shall tender an affidavit /undertaking to respondent No.3 Municipal Commissioner stating therein that if he suffers an adverse order in the pending proceedings for challenging the acquittal and his acquittal is converted into conviction, he shall return the entire gratuity amount within 8 weeks from such adverse judgment, subject to his right to challenge the said judgment. All consequences flowing from such conversion of acquittal into conviction would bind the petitioner to the extent

of the monetary reliefs that he would be getting in view of this order.

[b] After such affidavit is filed satisfying the above stated ingredients, the Corporation shall initiate steps for compliance of prayer clause "B" and ensure that such compliance is made within 12 (twelve) weeks from the date of the filing of such affidavit by the petitioner"

11. In the following Original Applications, this Tribunal has taken a similar view and disposed of O.As. which are as follows :-

- (v) O.A. No. 31/2021 (Mumbai) (Pandurang B. Borate Vs. The State of Maharashtra and Anr.), dated 28.10.2021.

12. So far as O.A. Nos.1012, 1013, 1014 & 1064 all of 2022 are concerned, the applicants therein are seeking direction in respect of their suspension period pursuant to their acquittal in the special cases and to make the payment of pay and allowances of the said period as per the Rule 72 (2)(3) & (4) of the Rules, 1981. So far as sub-rule (3) of Rule 72 of the Rules, 1981 is concerned, there is a rider to the effect that where the authority competent to order reinstatement is of the opinion that the suspension was wholly unjustified, the Government servant shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (8), be paid full pay and allowances to which he would have been entitled, had he not been There are some additional rider in suspended. terms of the proviso, which may not be relevant for the present discussion, but in terms of sub-rule (5) of Rule 72 of the Rules, 1981 in case other than those failing under sub-rule (2) and (3), the Government servant shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (8) and (9), be paid such amount (not being the whole) of the pay and allowances to which he would have been entitled, had he not been suspended, as the competent authority may

determine, after giving notice to the Government servant of the quantum proposed and after considering the representation, if any, submitted by him in that connection. Sub-rule (3)(4) & (5) of Rule 72 of the Rules, 1981 are reproduced herein below :-

> "72. Re-instatement of a Government servant after suspension and specific order of the competent authority regarding pay and allowances etc. and treatment of period as spent on duty-

1. .....

2. .....

3. Where the authority competent to order reinstatement is of the opinion that the suspension was wholly unjustified, the Government servant shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (8), be paid the full pay and allowances to which he would have been entitled, had he not been suspended:

Provided that where such authority is of the opinion that the termination of the proceedings instituted against the Government servant had been delayed due to reasons directly attributable to the Government servant, it may, after giving him an opportunity to make his representation within sixty days from the date on which the communication in this regard is served on him and after considering the representation, if any, submitted by him, direct, for reasons to recorded in writing, that the Government servant shall be paid of such delay only such amount (not being the whole ) of such pay and allowances as it may determine.

4. In a case falling under sub-rule (3) the period of suspension shall be treated as a period spent on duty for all purposes.

5. In cases other than those falling under subrules(2) and (3) the Government servant shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rules (8) and (9), be paid such amount (not being the whole) of the pay and allowances to which he would have been entitled had he not been suspended, as the competent authority may determine, after giving notice to the Government servant of the quantum proposed and after considering the representation, if any submitted by him in that connection within such period which in no case shall exceed, as may be specified in the notice."

13. In view of the aforesaid provisions, discretion lies with the competent authority to decide as to whether the suspension was wholly unjustified or not and then pass the appropriate order in terms of the provisions as aforesaid. In view of above, no specific directions can be issued to the respondent No. 3 to pass the order in terms of Rule 72 (3) & (4) of the Rules, 1981.

14. So far as O.A. No. 426/2023 is concerned, the said period of suspension of the applicant is concerned the respondent authorities have already considered the same. In view of the same, the applicant has not made any specific prayer in this regard.

15. In view of above discussions, I proceed to pass the following order :-

#### <u>O R D E R</u>

(i) O.A. Nos. 1012, 1013, 1014 & 1064 all of 2022 and 426 of 2023 are partly allowed.

(ii) The applicants shall tender an affidavit/ undertaking to respondents stating therein that if he suffers an adverse order in the pending proceedings for challenging the acquittal and his/their acquittal is converted into conviction, he/ they shall return the entire gratuity amount within 8 weeks from such adverse judgment, subject to his /their right to challenge the said judgment. All consequences flowing from such conversion of acquittal into conviction would bind the petitioner to the extent of the monetary reliefs that he/they would be getting in view of this order.

(iii) After such affidavit is filed satisfying the above stated ingredients, the respondents shall initiate steps for remittance of admissible monetary benefits within 12 (twelve) weeks from the date of the filing of such affidavit by the applicants.

# //23// O.A. 1012/2022 & 4 Ors.

(iv) The respondent No. 3 is hereby directed to take decision in respect of suspension period in terms of Rule 72(3), (4) & (5) of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Joining Time, Foreign Services and Payment During Suspension, Dismissal and Removal) Rules, 1981, as the case may be.

(v) In the circumstances, all these O.As. stand disposed of in the aforesaid terms. No order as to costs.
