Jagdale, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Smt. K.S. Gaikwad, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondent.</p> <p>2. The Applicants has filed this O.A. being aggrieved by order dated 28.01.2020 whereby punishment of withdrawing of two increments without cumulative effect was imposed by Respondent No.1 – The Additional Commissioner of Police, Pune.</p> <p>3. During the course of hearing, learned Advocate for the Applicant has pointed out that the Applicants have already filed appeal before the Respondent No.2 – The Director General of Police against the order of punishment but it is not decided.</p> <p>4. Though, The Director General of Police is Respondent No.2 in the present O.A., no Reply is filed by him. Respondent No.1 - The Additional Commissioner of Police, Pune only filed Reply and surprisingly made a statement that no appeal is filed against the appeal of punishment which is obviously incorrect.</p> <p>5. None is present from the Office of Respondent No.1 or 2.</p> <p>6. In view of above, the present O.A. needs to dispose of with direction to Respondent No.2 to decide the appeals filed by the Applicants on 16.07.2021 & 28.07.2021 within stipulated period since the decision on statutory appeal is still not taken by the appellate authority.</p>

7. O.A. is accordingly disposed of with direction to the Respondent No.2 to decide appeals preferred by the Applicants in accordance to law within two months from today and the decision as the case may be, shall be communicated to the Applicant.

8. The learned Advocate for the Applicant has also raised grievance about order dated 05.05.2021 whereby suspension of the Applicant is treated as suspension as such in view of punishment imposed by the disciplinary authority. However, since the appeal is still subjudice the decision to that effect will have to be taken afresh by the Respondent No.1 - The Additional Commissioner of Police, Pune in accordance to law. Therefore, order dated 05.05.2021 is set aside.

9. Respondent No.1 - The Additional Commissioner of Police, Pune is therefore directed to take decision afresh about the suspension period after decision of appeal by following due process of law and the decision as the case may be, shall be communicated to the Applicant.

10. If the Applicant felt aggrieved by the decision he may avail further remedy as may be permissible in law.

The State of Maharashtra & Ors. ..Respondents</p> <p>Heard Applicant in person and Ms. S.P. Manchekar, learned Chief Presenting Officer for the Respondents.</p> <p>2. Ld. CPO has submitted that Central Government has asked all the State Governments and the office of Government Pleaders to take up the issue of annual increments to be given to Government employees who retire on 30th June. Therefore all the matters will be taken up before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The matter which is decided by the Hon'ble Bombay High Court where the view is taken that such increment can be given to Government employees, is to be challenged before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Ld. PO pointed out para 8 of the affidavit in reply dated 26.10.2021 filed by Shri Nitin Ramchandra Gadre, Additional Chief Secretary (Accounts and Treasuries), Finance Department, Mantralaya, Mumbai, which reads:</p> <p align="center"><i>"8. I say and submit that the State Government could not take policy decision regarding grant of one notional increment (as due on 1st July) for the pensionary benefits to those employees who had retired on 30th June, which was neither intentional nor deliberate but only because the issue involved in the matter was subjudice before the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the question of law was open as mentioned in Para 5. The Government of India has subsequently requested all the States, vide letter dated 1.7.2021, to take necessary action in this matter as per provisions mentioned in the OA issued by DoPT&T vide dated 3.2.2021 and order dated 5.4.2021 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India as mentioned in para 6.</i></p> <p align="center"><i>In view of this above stated position and instructions received from government of India</i></p>

The applicant submits that SLP No.4422/2021 is pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court and only dates are taken in this matter. He submits that Hon'ble Gujarat High Court, Bombay High Court and the Tribunal has taken a view in favour of the Government servants holding them eligible for increment on 1st July though they are retired on 30th June. He submits that on that basis he is also to be granted benefit of annual increment though he is retired on 30th June. He be granted notional increment for the purpose of pensionary benefits though he retired on 30.6.2015. It is to be given subject to outcome of SLP.</p> <p data-bbox="732 981 1511 1347">4. Considering the submissions made by both the sides, we accept that the Hon'ble Bombay High Court and the Tribunal has taken this view. However, it is a fact that SLP No.4722/2021 is pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court involving the same issue. Under such circumstances, it will be cumbersome to hold that applicant is eligible for notional increment on 1st July though he retired on 30.6.2015 as it is final repercussion. If the Hon'ble Supreme Court decides against the prayer made by the applicant then it will be very difficult for the State to recover the amount paid to him.</p> <p data-bbox="732 1388 1511 1532">5. In view of this we are of the view that Government's action in taking policy decision at this stage is justifiable. However, as and when Hon'ble Supreme Court decides the matter, the State is bound to take decision immediately.</p> <p data-bbox="732 1573 1511 1646">6. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Shri A.J. Chougule, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.</p> <p>2. Suo moto speaking to minutes in para 2 of the order dated 4.8.2022. The date of first FIR "27.9.2001" is to be substituted as "27.9.2008". Accordingly, it is to be corrected and read.</p> <p>3. In the OA the applicant prays that applicant be deemed to be regular and permanent Class-I officer in the post of Project Officer having deemed to have been satisfactorily completed the probation period of two years as on 12.4.2008 as per GR dated 21.3.2000.</p> <p>4. In this matter Desk Officer and Law Officer from Tribal Department are present and inform that as the matter is pending before this Tribunal regarding satisfactory completion of probation period of the applicant the Tribal Department has sent the file to GAD thrice on 21.1.2021, 3.6.2021 and 29.7.2022. However, the GAD sent back the file thereby refusing to clear the file of satisfactory completion of probation period of the applicant on account of pendency of the criminal cases.</p> <p>5. We suo moto add GAD as party respondent no.2 as we have observed that Tribal Department is unable to take decision in absence of approval of GAD. We would like to point out that today we are not provided the reason given by GAD. Hence, we are handicapped to proceed in this matter.</p> <p>6. We call upon Deputy Secretary, GAD to remain present and enlighten us in respect of GR dated 28.3.1995 and 29.2.2016 wherein GAD itself has directed the concerned department to take decision in respect of</p>

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
completion of probation period within time or to remove the Government servant who are rendering unsatisfactory services during probation period or within grace period of three months thereafter. We would like to point out that applicant though joined the service on 10.4.2006 his probation period was to be completed on 10.4.2008 and if not as per concerned GR within grace period of three months i.e. on 10.7.2008. However, concerned department did not pass any order. Thereafter the applicant was prosecuted for offences of forgery, cheating and fraud and criminal case was registered against him. Department has initiated enquiry. Then second FIR was registered against him on 4.8.2009 for the similar offences and DE was initiated. However, record shows that applicant was exonerated on 17.8.2020 from first DE and further exonerated on 13.1.2022 from second DE though criminal cases are pending in criminal courts.

7. We would like to know from GAD when during the period which is prescribed under two GRs and grace period given for probation period no criminal case was registered against him, then why probation period was not deemed to be completed as per the GRs. Though criminal cases are pending against him, in two DEs he is exonerated. Under such circumstances, can we keep the case of the applicant pending in respect of probation period. GAD to support opinion along with relevant GRs and MCS Rules.

8. Ld. Advocate for the applicant pointed out that Shri Hariram Madavi, Project Officer in Tribal Department was appointed on 17.4.2006. He retired on 28.2.2017 without completion of probation period and his criminal case was pending under the Prevention of Corruption Act and DE was also pending against him. However, by order dated 27.1.2020 his probation period was brought to an end. We call upon GAD to show the rules and procedure followed in case of Shri Madavi to compare both the cases.

KoliApplicant Versus The State of Maharashtra & Ors.Respondents.</p> <p>1. Heard Shri A.V. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for the Applicant and Smt. Archana B.K., learned Presenting Officer for the Respondent.</p> <p>2. Today learned P.O. has tendered short Affidavit of behalf of Respondent No.2 along with G.R. dated 21.12.2019 and 12.06.2020. It is taken on record.</p> <p>3. Having heard learned Advocate for the Applicant for some time the issue involved in the present O.A. is about entitlement of Government servant for retiral benefits who were appointed on supernumerary post in view of invalidation of their caste certificate.</p> <p>4. Government through G.A.D. by G.R. dated 21.12.2019 had taken decision to appoint Government servant on supernumerary post whose caste certificate were invalidated. The said decision seems to have been taken in compliance of the order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in <i>Civil Appeal No.8928/2015 (Chairman and M.D., Food Corporation of India (F.C.I.) v/s. Gagdish Balram Bahira and others)</i> dated 06.07.2017.</p> <p>5. Later Government through G.A.D. issued another G.R. dated 12.01.2020 and appointed study group for making recommendation about the entitlement of such Government servant who are appointed on supernumerary post. As per this G.R. study group was to submit recommendation within three months. Thus on receipt of recommendation of study group Government was to take policy decision.</p>

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6. In present case also the issue is about entitlement to retiral benefits of a Government servant who was appointed on supernumerary post.

7. Learned P.O. on instruction from G.A.D. submits that study group has made some recommendation and now matter is in further process at the level of Government.

8. Indeed, the decision as the case may be ought to have been taken by this time, since the retiral benefits of so many employees are now held up. In this O.A. also Government servant died on 21.09.2020 but till date leave encashment, family pension & gratuity is not paid. O.A. therefore deserves to be decided expeditiously.

9. In view of above, Respondent No.3 is directed to file additional Affidavit to appraise the Tribunal about the decision of Government on the recommendation made by study group.


