The Applicant has challenged the transfer order dated 03.02.2021 whereby he is transferred from the post of Pl, Anti Human Trafficking Cell, Navi Mumbai to Pl, Motor Transport Theft Detection Unit, Navi Mumbai contending that it is mid-term and mid-tenure transfer without proper compliance of the provisions of Maharashtra Police Act.
- 3. Shri K. R. Jagdale, learned Counsel for the Applicant submits that the Applicant had hardly completed one year and seven months and he is transferred abruptly under the colorable exercise of powers, purportedly exercised by the Police Establishment Board (PEB) and prayed for interim relief.
- 4. Per contra, Ms N.G Gohad, learned P.O. had tendered the copy of PEB Minutes dated 03.02.2021 and on the basis of it, submitted that in view of default, the Applicant has been transferred invoking Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act and opposed interim relief.
- 5. Whereas, Smt. Punam Mahajan, learned Counsel for the Respondent No.2 stated that she has instructions to appear on behalf of the Respondent No.2 and seeks time to file reply.

#### Tribunal's orders

- 6. Perusal of PEB Minutes dated 03.02.2021 prima facie reveals that in view of alleged default, the PEB had exercised the powers under Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act which inter-alia empowers the PEB to transfer the police personnel mid-term in public interest, in exceptional cases and on account of administrative exigencies. In PEB Minutes, it is further stated that the Applicant is also censured for his lapses for not remaining present on 13.09.2020 in the meeting convened in reference to Maratha Kranti Morcha. True, no regular D.E. seems to have been initiated as urged by the learned Counsel for the Applicant but fact remains that he has been censured for breach of Rule 3 of Maharashtra Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1979.
- 7. As such, *prima-facie* there is compliance of Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act. I am, therefore, not inclined to grant interim relief.
- Issue notice before admission returnable on 12.02.2021.
- 9. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 10. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A.. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 11. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate emedy are kept open.
- 12. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.

- Per contra, Ms N.G Gohad, learned P.O. had tendered the copy of PEB Minutes dated 03.02.2021 and on the basis of it , submitted that in view of default, the Applicant has been transferred invoking Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act and opposed interim relief.
- Whereas, Smt. Punam Mahajan, learned Counsel for the Respondent No.2 stated that she has instructions to appear on behalf of the Respondent No.2 and seeks time to file reply.

#### Tribunal's orders

- 6. Perusal of PEB Minutes dated 03.02.2021 prima facie reveals that in view of alleged default, the PEB had exercised the powers under Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act which inter-alia empowers the PEB to transfer the police personnel mid-term in public interest, in exceptional cases and on account of administrative exigencies. In PEB Minutes, it is further stated that the Applicant is also censured for his lapses for not remaining present on 13.09.2020 in the meeting convened in reference to Maratha Kranti Morcha. True, no regular D.E. seems to have been initiated as urged by the learned Counsel for the Applicant but fact remains that he has been censured for breach of Rule 3 of Maharashtra Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1979.
- 7. As such, *prima-facie* there is compliance of Section 22N(2) of Maharashtra Police Act. I am, therefore, not inclined to grant interim relief.
- Issue notice before admission returnable on 12.02.2021.
- Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be ssued.
- 10. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A.. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 11. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate emedy are kept open.
- 12. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.
