Learned counsel submitted that her claim can be considered finally and the Tribunal is empowered to pass the appropriate further orders redressing grievance of the applicant. However, the entire further process cannot be stopped.
- 3. Learned Presenting Officer has supported the request made by learned counsel for respondent Nos. 3

- to 7. Learned P.O. submitted that in fact only because the interim order is operating, further decisions could not be taken.
- 4. Learned counsel for the applicant on instructions submitted that some subsequent developments have occurred wherein the zone of consideration has been widened, which has resulted in bringing the applicant in the zone of consideration. If this be so, it appears to me that even if the interim order is vacated, no prejudice is likely to be caused to the applicant and it may pave the way for considering the promotion of others who are due for promotion. It need not be stated that everything will be ultimately subject to outcome of the present O.A. Hence, the following order:-

2. It is the grievance of the applicant that she was seeking transfer either on the post at Government Hostel for Tribal Girls at Ralegaon, Dist. Yeotmal or at Government Hostel for Tribal Girls at Kalamb, Dist. Yeotmal on the ground of couple convenience. It is the case of the applicant that her husband is working at Wardha which is at short distance from Learned Counsel submitted that both places. Project Officer at Aurangabad has forwarded proposal of the applicant along with proposals of 2 other employees on the ground of couple convenience. Learned Counsel submitted that while requests of the 2 others have been considered by the respondents, request of the applicant has not been

considered. It is further submitted that in fact the applicant is senior to both the aforesaid employees. Learned Counsel further submitted that applicant has already completed her tenure at Aurangabad. It is further contended that posts at Ralegaon and Kalamb are vacant and till this date none is appointed on these posts. While issuing notice to the respondents, learned Counsel for the applicant has prayed for interim relief thereby directing the respondents to keep either of the abovesaid posts vacant till filing reply by the respondents in the present O.A.

3. Shri Gude, learned P.O. appearing for the respondent authorities opposed for grant of any such interim relief. Learned P.O. submitted that Hon'ble Supreme Court has time and again observed that Government employee does not have any vested right to claim posting at a particular place and in the circumstances the request of the applicant may not be considered. Learned P.O. submitted that he will file reply within 2 weeks by taking instructions in this regard.

- I have duly considered the submissions made 4. behalf of the applicant as well as the on respondents. Documents filed on record prima facie show that the applicant is due for transfer. It is further revealed that proposal for request transfers of 3 employees on the ground of couple convenience was forwarded by Project Officer at Aurangabad. It is brought to my notice that proposal sent regarding 2 others has been favorably considered. fair enough in submitting that Counsel was aforesaid is the provisional proposal and it is yet to be finalized. It is the only grievance of the applicant that same treatment has not been given to the applicant. It is submitted that till today no one has been given posting at Ralegaon or Kalamb.
- 5. It is true that Government employee cannot insist for his transfer or posting at a particular place, however, convenience of the applicant has to be considered by the respondents. In the present matter, it appears that in the case of the applicant same has not been done. In the circumstances, I deem it appropriate to pass the following order:

ORDER

- [i] Issue notice to respondents, returnable on 01-08-2023.
- [ii] In the meanwhile, if no one has been posted till this date at Ralegaon or Kalamb, till filing of reply either of the posts at the abovesaid places shall be kept vacant. If any person is already transferred or appointed at Ralegaon or Kalamb the said order be produced before the Tribunal.
- [iii] Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at once and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.

- 2. By filing the present Original Application the applicant has challenged the order dated 10.3.2023, whereby she has been transferred on promotion from Sillod District Aurangabad to Paranda District Osmanabad. In exception to the impugned order several grounds are raised by the applicant.
- 3. However, when the present matter was taken up for consideration, learned Presenting Officer raised a preliminary objection as about maintainability of the present O.A. Learned Presenting Officer pointed out that this being the order on promotion of the applicant the provisions under the Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 (for sort hereinafter called as "the Transfer Act of 2005") may not be applicable and the applicant cannot invoke the said provisions in oppose to the impugned order, whereby on promotion the applicant has been posted. There is

substance in the objection so raised on behalf of the respondents. I am convinced that the applicant cannot invoke the provisions of the Transfer Act, 2005 in the present matter.

- 4. Thereupon, learned counsel appearing for the applicant submitted that the present Original Application can be disposed of by giving directions to the respondents to consider the representation submitted by the applicant, which has not been considered by the respondents till date.
- 5. Learned Presenting Officer submitted that the impugned order has been passed in the month of March, 2023 and the applicant as per her own contention has not joined at the said place till date. Learned P.O. submitted that he has no objection for passing such order for considering the request of the applicant by the respondents, however, the said order shall not be interpreted to mean and be used by the applicant for avoiding action for not joining on the transferred place till date and by making such observations, if the order is passed the respondents may not have any objection.
- 6. Having regard to facts as aforesaid it appears to me that the right of the employee to make a representation if he is posted at a very inconvenient place either by way of transfer or even by way of promotion cannot be denied.

:: - 3 - :: O.A. NO. 195/2023

If such a representation is made, the respondents are expected to consider and decide such representation, of course on merits of the said application/representation. In the present matter though such representation is made, the respondents do not seem to have considered or decided the same. As such, the applicant has sought direction against the respondents to consider her request. If the representation of the applicant is not yet considered by the respondents, it would be open for the respondents to consider the said representation on its own merit. It is clarified that the absence of the applicant from the date of her transfer can be independently dealt with by the respondents.

7. With the observations as above, the O.A. stands disposed of without any order as to costs.

It is the grievance of the applicant that though he has given all 10 options for his transfer in the annual general transfers and though at the relevant time all those places were vacant or were likely to be vacant, the applicant has not been considered for any of those places and has been posted at Borol, Tq. Deoni, Dist. Latur, which is inconvenient for the applicant. learned counsel for the applicant submitted that the applicant is aged about 56 years and perhaps this may be his last posting. In the circumstances, according to learned counsel, the request of the applicant was

liable to be preferentially considered. The learned counsel submitted that after issuance of the impugned order first the applicant has raised objection against the said order and also submitted representation with the Government seeking posting at Civil Dispensary, Almala, Tq.. Ausa, Dist. Latur. The learned counsel submitted that the applicant has been relieved on 11.7.2023. The learned counsel, in the circumstances, has prayed for directions while issuing notices to the respondents to consider the representation of the applicant by the next date.

- 3. Shri S.K. Shirse, learned Presenting Officer appearing for the State authorities has sought time for filing the affidavit in reply and further submitted that unless instructions are fully received, it would not be appropriate on his part to make any submissions.
- 4. After having considered the submissions made by the parties discussed hereinabove, I deem it appropriate to pass the following order:-

ORDER

Issue notice to respondents, returnable on 29.8.2023. In the meanwhile, it would be open for the respondents to consider the representation submitted by the applicant on its own merits.

- 2. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at once and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 3. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on respondent/s intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of the case. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 4. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 5. The service may be done by hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgment be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry before due date. Applicant is directed to file affidavit of compliance and notice.
- 6. S.O. to 29.8.2023.
- 7. Steno copy and Hamdast is allowed to both parties.

Heard Shri J.B. Choudhary, learned counsel for the applicant and Shri I.S. Thorat, learned Presenting Officer for the respondent authorities.

2. This is one more matter wherein the applicant has come out with a grievance that by giving complete go-bye to the procedure laid down under the Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 (for short the Transfer Act, 2005) for effecting the transfers of the Government employees and even by discarding the guidelines issued by the Government itself under Government Resolution dated 9.4.2018, the applicant has been transferred. The learned counsel for the applicant submitted that the applicant admits that she is due for transfer and she is not seeking her retention on the present post. It is the specific contention raised on behalf of the applicant that before passing the

impugned order the respondents did not prepare the list of officers due for transfer. It is the further contention raised on behalf of the applicant that as laid down in the Government Resolution dated 9.4.2018 the procedure of counselling, as well as, inviting options/preferences from the officer due for transfer has also not been followed, which has caused some prejudice to the applicant. The learned counsel submitted that in several similar matters (O.A. No. 550/2023 & the batch order dated 6.7.2023) this Tribunal has passed interim order permitting the applicants therein to continue to work on their existing place, subject to a condition that, if somebody is already posted at the said place before passing order by the Tribunal, the concerned applicant may not have any right to retain at the said place. Similar order has been sought in the present matter.

3. Shri I.S. Thorat, learned Presenting Officer, though has opposed for grant of interim relief as has been prayed for and has sought time to file the affidavit in reply, has not made out any ground making out any case for not taking similar view as has been taken in the earlier orders.

4. After having considered the submissions made by the parties discussed hereinabove, I deem it appropriate to pass the following order:-

ORDER

- 1. Issue notice to respondents, returnable on 25.7.2023, till then the respondents shall permit the applicant to discharge her duties on her existing post.
- 2. It is clarified that if it is noticed that any appointment or transfer has been made in place of the applicant and said person has been relieved from his earlier post prior to passing of this order, the applicant would be liable to be relieved from her existing post.
- 3. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at once and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 4. Applicants are authorized and directed to serve on respondent/s intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of the case. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 5. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.

Heard Shri V.B. Wagh, learned counsel for the applicant, Shri V.R. Bhumkar, learned Presenting Officer for the respondent authorities and Shri R.N. Bharaswadkar, learned counsel for respondent no.3.

2. It is the case of the applicant that he was posted at Kalamnuri, Tq. Kalamnuri, Dist. Hingoli vide order dated 6.9.2021. It is the further contention of the applicant that he had applied for his transfer by request from the present place either at Kinwat in Nanded District, or at Pune or at Gadchorili. However, it is further case of the applicant that since the reason for which he was seeking his transfer from Kalamnuri to said places since was resolved, he within few days again communicated to the competent authority i.e. the Secretary, Tribal Development Department not to consider his earlier request for his request transfer at the aforesaid 3 places and to retain him till he completes ordinary tenure at the present place i.e. at

Kalamnuri. It is the further case of the applicant that in spite of aforesaid communication, vide order dated 11.7.2023 the respondents have posted respondent no. 3 in his place by promoting him to the said post. The learned counsel for the applicant has sought quashment of the said order by filing the present Original Application impliedly seeking his retention at the present post.

3. Shri V.R. Bhumkar, learned Presenting Officer has sought time to file the affidavit in reply. learned P.O. further contended for want instructions even on facts he cannot make any concrete submissions. The learned P.O., however, on principle opposed for grant of any interim relief as has been prayed by the applicant. The learned P.O. submitted that the respondent no. 3 has been posted in place of the applicant on transfer. there is no order revealing of the further posting of the applicant. Learned PO submitted that the applicant cannot dispute the right of respondents to make postings considering the administrative convenience of any other employee by way of promotion or by way of transfer. The learned P.O.

submitted that the applicant cannot as of right seek his retention on the present post. He further contended that after instructions are received the reasons may be disclosed for not considering the request of the applicant for his retention on the said post and unless such information brought on record, it would be unjust to grant any interim relief as has prayed by the applicant.

4. Shri R.B. Bharaswadkar, learned counsel appearing for respondent no. 3 while concurring with the submissions made by the learned P.O. appearing on behalf of the respondent authorities further added that the Civil Services Board after having considered all the circumstances have taken the conscious decision to post respondent no. 3 on promotion in place of the applicant and accordingly the order has been passed. The learned counsel reiterated the contentions raised on behalf of the State authorities about the powers of the State and the limitation of the Government employees for challenging such orders.

5. I have duly considered the submissions made by the learned counsel appearing for the applicant, learned P.O. for respondent authorities and the learned counsel appearing for respondent no. 3. It is true that the Government employee cannot insist for his posting at any particular place or can seek his retention as of right. It is also true that the applicant had initially made a request for his transfer either at Kinwat in Nanded District, or at Gadchiroli or at Pune. The applicant has further placed on record the letter dated 23.5.2023, whereby he had communicated to the Secretary of Tribal Development that he is withdrawing his applications so made for request transfer at the aforesaid places and thereafter the impugned order has been passed, whereby the respondent no. 3 has been appointed by way of promotion in place of the applicant. As has been submitted by the learned P.O. why the request of the applicant for his retention has not been considered is undisclosed in the impugned order and reasons would be revealed only the respondents relevant submit their affidavit in reply with documents. Respondent No. 3 has been posted in place of the applicant vide order dated 11.7.2023

and he has been given 30 days' time for joining the said post. Presently respondent No. 3 is working at Rajur Tq. Akole Dist. Ahmednagar and he has not been relieved yet. No one has been posted in place of respondent No. 3 at Rajur.

6. Having considered the facts as aforesaid it appears to me that when respondent No. 3 is having time to resume at his promotional post at Kalumnari till 11.8.2023, before one week of that date the respondents shall file affidavit in reply so that the matter can be considered and finally disposed of before 11.8.2023. Hence, I pass the following order:-

ORDER

Issue notice to respondents, returnable on 4.8.2023, till then the status quo as on today be maintained.

- 2. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at once and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 3. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on respondent/s intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of the case. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
