Secretary, Pocket 14, Sector-8 Dwarka, Phase-I, New Delhi-77" and "The Director, Sri Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Trivendrum-695 011 and to issue specific directions to this newly added respondents to file affidavit in reply on the point as to whether Master of Public Health (MPH) of Sri Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Trivendrum is a Post Graduate Degree as per Gazette Notification dated 08/12/2010 and 14/11/2022 read with Public Notice dated 15/12/2022 issued by National Medical Commission (Erstwhile Medical Council of India).

3. The Original Applicants have prayed for specific relief in the form of declaration that, Master of Public Health (MPH) Degree of the Sri Chitra

Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Trivendrum is adequate Post Graduate qualification for promotion in District Health Officer Cadre, Group –A against 75% quota earmarked for Post Graduate Degree Holders as per Civil Surgeon Cadre, Group –A and District Health Officer Cadre, Group –A in the Maharashtra Health Services, Group-A (Recruitment) Rules, 2021.

4. There is no prayer for determination of equivalence of MPH Degree with MDPSM Degree. The respondents in their affidavit in reply attempted to bring on record the issue of equivalence. Hence, it is necessary to add these two parties for resolving the controversy of equivalence raised by the respondents.

By this application, the applicant is seeking condonation of delay of 3 years, 10 months and 22 days caused in filing the accompanying O.A. under section 19 of the Administrative Tribunals Act challenging the impugned order dated 02-12-2016 (Annexure A-4) issued by respondent no.3 whereby the salary of the applicant was brought down by one step and consequential recovery order dated 30-12-2016 issued by the Deputy Dairy Manager i.e. respondent no.4.

The applicant has contended that he preferred departmental appeal against the said order but that was filed beyond prescribed period of limitation and as such the said appeal was rejected on the ground of limitation by order dated 14-05-2018 (Annexure A-6). This application is made seeking condonation of delay of about 3 years and 17 days caused in filing the accompanying O.A. under section 19 of the Tribunals Administrative Act challenging punishment order dated 20-03-2017 (Annexure A-5) issued by respondent no.3 and further impugned order dated 03-11-2017 (Annexure A-7) issued by respondent no.2 in departmental appeal whereby the appeal was dismissed. As per the said order dated 03-11-2017, the applicant was advised to file revision application, if any, against the said order within 60 days. The applicant has filed the revision application in December, 2017 (Annexure A-8).
- 3. Subsequently, respondent no.2 issued corrigendum dated 01-03-2019 (Annexure A-9)

stating that no revision is provided against the order in departmental appeal. Applicant received the said corrigendum order dated 01-03-2019 in May, 2019. Considering the facts on record, it is evident that after the impugned order dated 03-11-2017 (Annexure A-7) issued by respondent no.2 applicant bona fide persuaded his remedy in revision as asked for by filing the revision in December, 2017 itself. During the pendency of the said revision, corrigendum dated 01-03-2019 (Annexure A-9) was issued whereby it was mentioned that the remedy of revision is not available. In the circumstances, it is evident that the applicant was prosecuting his remedy of revision bona fide. No any negligence or mala fide intention can be attributed to the applicant in that regard. In view of the same, cause of action for filing the O.A. arose in May, 2020 after he received the corrigendum dated 01-03-2019.

4. It is the matter of record that there was CORONA pandemic situation from March, 2020 to July, 2021. In a *suo motu* petition the Hon'ble

Supreme Court has been pleased to hold that for the cause of action for filing any litigation in the pandemic period the point of limitation has to be exempted. - 2. The applicant has approached this Tribunal against the order dated 21.3.2023, whereby he has been suspended by respondent No. 1 in contemplation of the departmental enquiry to be conducted against him. The order of suspension has been thus, passed by invoking powers under Rule 4 (1) (a) of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Discipline and Appeal) Rules, 1979.
- 3. Shri S.D. Joshi, learned counsel appearing for the applicant submitted that the applicant is not disputing the right of the State authorities to conduct the departmental enquiry against him and the applicant is ready to face the said departmental

enquiry and is confident that he will prove his innocence during the course of the said enquiry. Learned counsel submitted that the applicant is aggrieved by the order of suspension, which is unwarranted, unnecessary and casts stigma on the unblemished career of the applicant.

Learned counsel further submitted that it is 4. well settled that in every matter of departmental enquiry, order of suspension is not warranted and it cannot be passed as a matter of routine. He further submitted that unless the charges leveled against the delinquent are of such nature that no fair enquiry is possible to be conducted without suspending the applicant that the delinquent is to be suspended or else not. Learned counsel submitted that considering the charges leveled against the applicant there appears no need of suspending the applicant. Learned counsel further submitted that since alleged charges leveled against the applicant pertain to his previous posting, there is no possibility of applicant tampering with the evidence or bring undue influence on any of the witnesses to be examined in the said departmental

enquiry. In the circumstances, learned counsel has prayed for staying the effect and operation of the order dated 21.3.2023 temporarily while issuing the notices to the respondents.

- 5. Learned C.P.O. appearing for the State authorities has strongly opposed the submissions so He submitted that in respect of the made. misconduct alleged against the applicant 'Star Question' was raised in the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly and in view of the discussion which took place upon the said 'Star Question' that the respondents have ordered the suspension of the present applicant. Learned C.P.O. further submitted that unless due instructions are received it may also not be possible for him to make a statement as to which were the grounds prevailing in the minds of disciplinary authority while ordering the the suspension of the applicant. Learned C.P.O. in the circumstances has sought time to file affidavit in reply and has prayed for rejecting the request of interim relief made by the applicant.
- 6. I have duly considered the submissions made on behalf of the applicant and State authorities. I have also perused the documents filed on record.

7. As noted herein above, the applicant is not intending to raise any challenge to the action of the respondents or initiating departmental enquiry against him. His grievance in the present O.A. is that without any cogent and sufficient reason and when it is not warranted the respondents have put him under suspension. As has been submitted by the learned counsel the allegations which are leveled against the applicant because of which the respondents have decided to conduct departmental enquiry against him pertain to the period prior to 2019 and more particularly when the applicant was posted at Igatpuri and Niphad in Nashik District. Learned counsel submitted that if the ACRs of the applicant of the said period are perused, in every year the performance of the applicant has been assessed as "outstanding". It is also brought to my notice that in the year 2017, the applicant was also awarded an advance increment for his excellent work. Learned counsel alleged impugned action as vindictive. It is also contended that the applicant has whispered about initiation of enquiry against him much prior to initiation of such enquiry.

- 8. It has been argued by Shri S.D. Joshi that some matters like the present cannot be viewed in routine manner and in such matters the Tribunal has to consider the circumstances brought on record by the delinquent even while considering the matter at the initial stage and shall protect the Government servants like the applicant from such harsh action which casts stigma on their career. As against it, learned C.P.O. has come out with a contention that unless sufficient instructions are received to him it may not be possible for him to make any statement even about the necessity of putting the applicant under suspension.
- 9. It may not be disputed that the Government employee can be suspended in contemplation of Departmental Enquiry as provided under rule 4 (1) (a) of the M.C.S. (Discipline and Appeal) Rules, 1979. It is also true that if the aforesaid provision in the rules is plainly read, it is not qualified with any provision prescribing circumstances necessary for putting the Govt. employee under suspension pending departmental enquiry against him. However, the Hon'ble Apex Court and the Hon'ble

High Courts have always deprecated the practice of placing the employee under suspension when it is unwarranted. One such order is placed on record by the learned counsel appearing for the applicant in the matter of State of Orissa through its Principal Secretary, Home Department Vs. Bimal Kumar Mohanty (1994) 4 SCC 126 in support of the contentions raised by the applicant. In the matters of suspension unless the entire facts come on record, no effective conclusion can be arrived at. At present the version of applicant is only available. It appears that past service record of the applicant is noteworthy, even then without giving opportunity to the respondents to explain the circumstances necessitating the suspension of the applicant, it would be unsafe to pass any interim order as prayed by the applicant. Hence, the following order

2. When the present matter is taken up for consideration and the arguments of the learned counsel for the applicant, as well as, learned Presenting Officer are heard for some time, it is revealed that the applicant is having the alternate efficacious remedy of filing an appeal before the appellate authority. In fact, the applicant has preferred such appeal before the appellate authority on 16.3.2023, however, without waiting for the decision by the appellate authority, the applicant has preferred the present Original Application. In view of the provisions under Sections 20 & 21 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985, the application submitted by the applicant may not be entertained by this Tribunal.

- 3. Learned counsel for the applicant at this juncture submits that the applicant will pursue the appeal filed by him. He however, expressed the anxiety that appeals are not decided and kept pending for indefinite period. In the circumstances the learned counsel sought indulgence of the Tribunal only to the extent of giving directions to the appellate authority to decide the appeal filed by the applicant within time bound manner. The request so made appears to be reasonable.
- In the order passed by this Tribunal on 21.3.2023 the respondents were directed to make submissions on the request so made by the applicant for change in her headquarter during the period of her suspension. In paragraph 6 of the affidavit in reply filed by the respondents, it has been explained by the respondents that with an intention of free and fair investigation of the irregularities made by the applicant, her headquarter has been made at Jalgaon Jamod District Buldhana. On query made by the Tribunal it is informed that Jalgaon Jamod is at the distance of about 275 km from Aurangabad. Learned

counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant may be given opportunity to make a request to the authorities for change in her headquarters also. As has been requested the applicant may, in the representation to be submitted by her, request for change in the headquarters during the period of suspension. The respondents shall consider the said request also having regard to the fact that the headquarters at presently given is at the distance of about 275 km from Aurangabad.

5. In the circumstances without going into the merits of the contentions raised in the O.A., the present Original Application can be disposed of by giving following directions. Hence, the order: -

ORDER

- (i) Respondent No. 1 shall decide the appeal preferred by the applicant on 16.3.2023 on its own merit as expeditiously as possible and preferably within the period of 8 weeks from the date of this order.
- (ii) It need not be stated that the order passed by the appellate authority can be subject matter of scrutiny before this Tribunal.
