- 2. Learned Advocate for Applicant states that Applicant was working on the post of 'Medical Officer' in 'District Hospital, Aundh, Pune' from 01.04.2012 upto 06.12.2021.
- 3. Learned Advocate for Applicant further stated that Applicant was relieved from post of 'Medical Officer, in District Hospital, Aundh, Pune' on 06.12.2021 even though she came to be transferred two different places viz.(1) 'PHC Nere, Tahsil Bhor, District Pune' and (ii) 'PHC Nira, Tahsil Purandar, District Pune'.
- 4. Learned Advocate of Applicant thereupon state that on 20.06.2023 in pursuance to Application dated 30.05.2023 made by Applicant to the 'District Health Officer, Zilla Parishad, Pune', cognizance was finally taken by the 'Director of Health Services' who narrated all developments that had place since Transfer Order dated 09.08.2021 till Application dated 30.05.2023 and sought further guidance from 'Commissioner of Health Services, Mumbai' about posting of Applicant.
- 5. Learned Advocate of Applicant further stated that 'Principal Secretary, Public Health Department' had directed the 'Director of Health Services' on 18.10.2023 to conduct 'Counselling Session' in relation to those 'Medical Officers-Group-A' who have been absent for less than 5 Years'.
- 6. Learned Advocate for Applicant states that in 'Counselling Session' she has requested to be posted as 'Medical Officer' in (i) 'State Urban Leprosy Unit, Yashwantrao Chavan Memorial Hospital, Pune' or (ii) 'District Tuberculosis Centre, Pune'.
- 7. Learned PO contends about the limitation period as Applicant has approached after long time having

being relieved from post of 'Medical Officer, in District Hospital, Aundh, Pune' on 06.12.2021.

- 8. Learned PO nonetheless to seek information from the 'Commissioner of Health Services, Mumbai' as to whether they are willing to consider request submitted by Applicant during the 'Counselling Session' to be posted on 'Medical Officer' in (i) 'State Urban Leprosy Unit, Yashwantrao Chavan Memorial Hospital, Pune' or (ii) 'District Tuberculosis Centre, Pune' in consideration of the fact that she is 'Single Mother' and as Applicant had been running from 'Pillar to Past' since 06.12.2021 after being relieved from post of 'Medical Officer' in 'District Hospital, Aundh, Pune'.
- 9. The office objections, if any, are to be removed and court fees to be paid, if not already paid.
- 10. Issue notice before admission returnable on 05.03.2024.

Heard Shri A. V. Bandiwadekar, learned Advocate for Applicants, Shri A. J. Chougule, learned Presenting dfficer for the Respondents and Shri K. R. Jagdale, learned Counsel for Respondent No.3.

- Learned Advocate for Applicant submits that Applicant who was working on post of 'Tahsildar Thane' has been transferred on deputation to post of 'Tahsildar' in MMRDA Mumbai' by kevenue and Forest Department bovernment Order dated 15.02.2024.
- Learned Advocate for Applicant further states that Applicant had completed 'Normal Tenure' of 3 Years on the post of 'Tahsildar Thane'. However, Revenue and Forest Department Government Order dated 15.02.2024 by which Applicant is transferred to post of 'Tahsildar' in 'MMkDA, Mumbai' being 'Deputation Post' for cadre of Tahsildar; it required prior consent of Applicant as well as concurrence from Urban Development Department.
- Learned Advocate for Applicant then drew attention to 'District Collector and DEO Thane' letter dated 27.06.2023 addressed to Additional Chief Secretary and Chief Electoral Officer Maharashtra State requesting that the post of the 'Special Executive Magistrate, Collector Office, Thane' be notified as 'Assistant Electoral Registration

Officer' for '147-Kopri Panchpakhadi Assembly Constituency' on grounds of 'Administrative Convenience'.

- Learned Advocate for Applicant then drew attention to 'Notification' dated 24.01.2024 issued by Election Commission of India to appoint 'Assistant 'Returning Officers' under 'Section 22' of 'Representation of People Act, 1951' to assist the 'Returning Officer' of 25-Thane: Parliamentary Constituency. Insofar as 25-Thane Parliamentary Constituency is concerned, it is the 'Additional Collector, Thane' who is notified as the 'Returning Officer' whereas for '147- Kopri Panchpakhadi Assembly Constituency' it is the 'Deputy Collector, Rehabilitation, Thane' who is notified as 'Assistant Returning Officer'. Thus, the Applicant while serving on post of 'Tahsildar, Thane' was not to be associated directly with conduct of 'General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024'.
  - the difference between the Election Commission of India, letter dated 09.01.2014 applicable at the time of conduct of 'General Election to Lok Sabha: 2014' and present set of instructions contained in Election Commission letter dated 21.12.2023 appliable to the conduct of 'General Election to Lod Sabha: 2024'. He says that it was pertinent to note that earlier instructions of Election Commission were applicable to all District Officers, Police Officers and Protection and Excise Officers' whether they were connected to election either directly or indirectly, whereas current instructions have been made applicable only in respect of those who are directly connected with conduct of

'General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024'

### Tribunal's orders

Learned P.O. produces copy of 'File Noting' including recommendations of 'CSB' in respect of Applicant as well as Respondent No.3'. The 'Minutes of Meeting' of CSB' indicate that 'Respondent No.3' was initially proposed to be ransferred on the post of 'Tahsildar' Ambernath, District Thane'. However, it was not approved by next 'Superior Transferring Authority' and returned back reconsideration; whereupon 'Respondent No.3' was then proposed to be transferred to post of 'Tahsildar, Devgad, District Sindhudurg'. However, this proposal was also returned back for reconsideration but transfer of 'Respondent No.3' to post of 'Tahsildar, Devgad, District Sindhudurg' was reaffirmed. The proposal was not finally accepted by next 'Superior Transferring Authority' and 'Respondent No.3' was directed to be posted on post of 'Tahsildar Thane'. However, the recommendation in respect of 'Applicant' as made by 'CSB' to be posted on post of 'Tahsildar' in 'MMRDA, Mumbai' came to be approved by 'Competent Transferring Authority' and next 'Superior Transferring Authority'. Learned PO finally states that 'Respondent No.3' has assumed charge of post of 'Tahsildar Thane' on 20.02.2024.

The Applicant by letter dated 25.01.2024 addressed to Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue), Revenue and Forest Department had requested not to transfer him from post of 'Tahsildar Thane' although he had completed 'Normal Tenure' of 3 Years because 'Criminal Case' was pending against him and therefore he could not be associated with/deployed on election related duty relating to 'General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024'. The Applicant had thus requested that he be transferred during the 'General

rransfer: 2024'. Also in case of Applicant, the 'CSB' had recommended Extension of Tenure by 1 Year on the post of Tahsildar Thane'. Hence, recommendations of 'CSB' were pverruled both in respect of Applicant and Respondent No.3. Further also the fact that transfer of Respondent No.3 to post of 'Tahsildar Thane' should have been done only after consultations with 'Additional Chief Secretary and Chief Electoral Officer Maharashtra State' as per provision of 'Para 8' in the Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023. However, these directions in 'Para 8' of Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023 were not observed before issue of Revenue and Forest Department Government Order dated 15.02.2024 to transfer Respondent No.3 who was working on post of 'Tahsildar cum Competent Authority No.9', in 'SRA Mumbai' to the post of 'Tahsildar, Thane'. Further transfer of Applicant to post of 'Tahsildar' in 'MMRDA, Mumbai' being 'Foreign Service' required consent from Applicant as per provisions of 'Rule 36' of Maharashtra Civil Services (Joining Time, Foreign Service and Payments during Suspension, Dismissal and Removal), Rules, 1981.

9. The transfer of Applicant to post of 'Tahsildar' in 'MMRDA, Mumbai' being 'Foreign Service' could not have been done without consent of Applicant. No compelling reason to overrule the recommendations of 'CSB' for 'Extension of Tenure' by 1 Year of the Applicant on the post of 'Tahsildar Thane'. The Applicant had himself requested the Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue), Revenue and Forest Department that he be transferred only during 'General Transfer: 2024'. 'Interim Relief' is not being granted at this stage because 'Respondent No.3' has

- 1. Heard Shri M. D. Lonkar, learned Advocate for Applicant and Smt. Archana B. K., learned Presenting Officer for Respondents
- 2. Learned Counsel for Applicant stated that Applicant who was working on the post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS), Thane' has been transferred by Revenue and Forest Department Government Order dated 15.02.2024 to vacant post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Raigad' under provisions of Section 4(4)(ii) and Section 4(5) of the Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 in view of the directions in Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023.
- 3. Learned Advocate for Applicant further stated that both these posts are not included in the 'Notification' under 'Section 22' of the 'Representation of People Act, 1951' of 'Assistant Returning Officers' for 'General Election of Lok Sabha 2024' and consequently directions of Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023 were not applicable to Applicant.
- 4. Learned Advocate for Applicant thereupon stated that Applicant has completed Normal Tenure of 3 Years on post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Thane' was thus liable to be transferred under 'General Transfer: 2024' but not under provisions of Section 4(4)(ii) and 4(5) of Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005.

- 5. Learned Advocate for Applicant then submitted that no other officer from the cadre of 'Deputy Collectors' has been posted in place of applicant on post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Thane'.
- 6. Learned P.O. states that transfer of Applicant from post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Thane' to 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Raigad' was in accordance with provisions of Section 4(4)(ii) and 4(5) of Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 for which the 'Specific Reasons' and 'Exceptional Circumstances' considered were directions in Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023 regarding 'General Election to Lok Sabha 2024'.
- 7. The directions in Election Commission of India in letter dated 21.12.2023 are only in respect of 'District Officers' such as Additional Collectors; Deput Collectors; Tahsildars and Naib Tahsildars who are directly connected with conduct of General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024. However, neither the present post of Applicant which is Deputy Collector (EGS), Thane nor the post of Deputy Collector (EGS) Raigad to which he stands transferred by Revenue and Forest Department Government Order dated 15.02.2024 are those of 'Assistant Returning Officers' notified under 'Section 22' of the 'Representation of People Act, 1951' which would have necessitated transfer to be done under Section 4(4)(ii) and 4(5) of Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005.
- The transfer of Applicant has happened because District Collector & DEO Thane' has not diligently acted on clear directions given by Revenue and Forest Department etter dated 20.01.2024 to Divisional Commissioners to submit the lists of District Officers such as Additional Collectors; Deputy Collectors; Tahsildars and Naib ahsildars who would be directly connected with or ssociated with / deployed for election related duty for General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024'. The Applicant had imself made representation on 23.01.2024 to bring it to he notice of Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue), Revenue and Forest Department that he cannot even be associated with / deployed on election related duty regarding 'General lection to Lok Sabha: 2024' because of Specific Directions ih 'Para 6 (v)' of Election Commission of India letter dated 21.12.2023 as he has 'Criminal Case' pending against him in

'District and Session Court Thane'. The Applicant had requested that as he has completed 'Normal Tenure' of 3 years, he be transferred during 'General Transfer 2024'. Hence considering these facts and circumstances of the case of Applicant, there was no such compelling reasons to immediately transfer Applicant by invoking provisions of Section 4(4)(ii) and Section 4(5) of Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005. Further, the Applicant is not to be directed to join on vacant post of 'Deputy Collector (EGS) Raigad'.

- 9. The office objection, if any, are to be removed and court fees to be paid, if not already paid.

Learned Advocate for Applicant then referred to Revenue & Forest Department letter dated 20.01.2024 to Divisional Commissioners by which they were directed to submit proposals for transfer of 'District Officers' such as Additional Collector, Deputy Collector, Tahsildar and Naib Tahsildar except those who are to be exempted for justiciable reasons along with their 'Certificate' signed by 'District Collectors & DEO'.
- 7. The Learned Advocate for Applicant also submitted copy of letter written by Divisional Commissioner, Pune to Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue), Revenue & Foret Department on 05.02.2024 along with Certificate in respect of Applicant which mentions that he will not be assigned any work related to 'General Election of Lok Sabha 2024'. The 'District Collector and DEO Pune' had submitted 10. the letter of Applicant to 'Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue) Revenue and Forest Department' on 10.01.2024 with request not to transfer Applicant. The Applicant was thus not to be directly or indirectly involved with any election work related to 'General Election to Lok Sabha: 2024' as communicated by District Collector & DEO Pune's etter dated 10.01.2024. In addition District Collector & DEO, Pune on 31.01.2024 had again written to Divisional Commissioner, Pune and thereupon commissioner Pune on 05.02.2024 had written to Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue), Revenue and Forest Department about Applicant clearly mentioning that he will not to be assigned any work in respect of 'General Election o Lok Sabha 2024'. The 'Certificate' was belatedly issued y 'District Collector and DEO Pune' on 31.01.2024 because pplicant had submitted letter once again to District collector, Pune on 31.01.2024. However, the letters of bistrict Collector & DEO Pune' on 31.01.2024 and Divisional Commissioner, Pune' along with 'Certificates' submitted to Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue) Revenue and Forest Department make it evident that they had desired that Applicant who suffers from health problems relating to mobility due to 'Serious Accident' be treated as par with the other 4 Deputy Collectors who were suffering from ailments such as 'Cancer' and 'Brain Tumor'.
