The issue is so momentous as it is simple to place on record the stand of the Government with regard to the status of the Applicant on the anvil of whether he fallswithin the clerical cadre. That simple answer would go a long way in assisting us for an appropriate decision of this OA. As a matter of fact, we could as well have very safely and very accurately proceeded on the basis of absence of traverse, even if it had directly benefited the Applicant straightway, but still in the interest of justice, we give one more opportunity to Respondent No.1 to place on record an Affidavit answering to this important question. Though the Affidavit of Respondent No.3 is on record, he will have to file an Additional Affidavit explaining as to why the persons exactly so similarly placed as and Applicant were allowed to appear at exammation including Mr. Gade.
