ORDER

- 1. Heard Smt. Punam Mahajan, learned Counsel for the Applicant and Smt. Kranti Gaikwad, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.
- 2. In the present O.A., the Applicant has challenged the impugned transfer order dated 16.09 2019 whereby he was transferred from the post of Associate Professor, B. J. Govt. Medical Collage, Pune to Associate Professor, Ramanand Tirtha, Rural Government Medical Collage, Ambejogal.
- 3. Learned Counsel for the applicant submits that the impugned transfer order dated 16.09 2019 is mid-term and purportedly made on the basis of complaints which are nonexistent and only to accommodate Dr. Jadhav in place of the Applicant.
- Per contra, learned P.O. submits that transfer of the Applicant was necessitated on account of complaints as well as in view of the promotion of Dr. Jadhav as only two posts were available in the B. J. Medical Collage, Pune. She further submits that the transfer has been approved by the Civil Services Board as well as by the Hon'ble Minister and Hon'ble Chief Minister.



- 5. Perusal of file tendered before the Tribunal reveals that the Civil Services Board which recommended transfer of the Applicant, was consist of only two members. Whereas, as per Govt. Resolution, the CSB shall consist of three members. There is absolutely no reference of third member in the Minutes of CSB. Learned P.O. sought to submit that third member was not available. However, this fact is not recorded in the Minutes of CSB nor his name is referred anywhere in the Minutes of CSB. Indeed, Minutes of CSB reveals that CSB proceeded on the assumption that it consists of only two members. As such, constitution of CSB is not in accordance to the Govt. Resolution.
- 6. Secondly in Minutes of CSB, there is reference of the complaints of Shri Shaikh and Shri Gautam Sathe. In so far as complaint of Shri Shaikh is concerned, learned Counsel for the Applicant tendered the copy of enquiry repot submitted by Shri Pawar on 20.08.2019 wherein he stated that on receipt of complaint of Shr Shaikh, he called upon him by issuing notices through post twice. However, postal correspondence returned back. The Enquiry Officer, therefore, held that there is no substance in the complaint it being anonymous complaint. As such, in so far as complaint of Shri Shaikh is concerned, it is already closed.
- 7. As regard compliant of Sri Gautam Sathe, there is nothing on record to show that the said compliant was enquired into or verified by the Competent Authority as required in term of Circular dated 11.02.2015. As per Circular dated 11.02.2019, the employee cannot be transferred mid-term on the basis of such complaint only. The Competent Authority is required to ascertain veracity of allegations made in the complaint. In case substance is found in the complaint, in that event, the Authority is required to take disciplinary action against the employee and may recommend for transfer after recording the reason in this regard. However, in the present case, prima-facie there is no such compliance of instructions contained in the Circular dated 11.02.2015. Thirdly, prima-facie the Applicant has been displaced only to accommodate Dr. Jadhav who was promoted on ad-hoc basis. If third post was not available then Dr. Jadhav could have been posted at somewhere else instead of displacing the Applicant mid-term.

8. In view of above, I am satisfied that prima-facie case is made out to stay on implementation of transfer order dated 16.09.2019.

9. For the aforesaid reasons, interim stay is granted in terms of prayer clause 10(a) of O.A.

10. Issue notice before admission returnable on 18.10.2019.

11. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.

12. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A.. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.

- 1. Heard Shri C. T. Chandratre, learned Counsel for the Applicant and Shri A. J. Chougule, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.
- 2. The Applicant is challenging the transfer order dated 29.08.2019 and seeking interim stay.
- 3. Earlier the Applicant was posted as Medical Officer at District Hospitai, Satara by order dated 18.08.2019. Accordingly, he joined there. Later, by another order dated 05.03.2019, he was transferred to Primary Health Centre, Nagthane, Dist. Satara. However, he was not relieved and continued to function at Satara.
- 4. On the above background, abruptly the impugned order dated 29.08.2019 is issued by the Respondents whereby the Applicant is transferred to Primary Health Centre, Umbrde, Tal. Vaibhavwadi, Dist. Sindhudurg.
- 5. Learned Counsel for the Applicant submits that his client is still working in District Hospital, Satara and submits that the impugned transfer order is in blatant violation of provision of Maharashtra Government Servants Regulation of Transfers and Prevention of Delay in Discharge of Official Duties Act, 2005 (hereinafter referred to as 'Act 2005).
- 6. Perusal of impugned order dated 29.08.2019 does not reveal the observance of placing the matter before Civil Services Board and compliance of provision of Section 4(5) of 'Act 2005'. Thus, prima-facie, provisions of 'Act 2005' are bypassed.

Tribunal's orders

- 7. Learned P.O. for the Respondents sought to contend that the Applicant was posted at Umbrde for administrative convenience and opposed grant of interim stay.
- 8. Prima-facie, there is no observance of provision of 'Act 2005'. I am, therefore, inclined to grant interim stay.
- 9. In view of above, interim stay in terms of prayer clause 10(a) of the O.A. is granted.
- 10. Issue notice before admission returnable on 18.10.2019.
- 11. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 12. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O₂A.. Respondents are put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 13. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 14. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.
- 15. In case notice is not collected within seven days or service report on affidavit is not filed 3 days before returnable date, Original Application shall stand dismissed without reference to Tribunal and papers be consigned to record.
