ORDER

1. The applicants pray that the Respondent No. 1 be directed to prepare a fresh list of qualified candidates for the post of Police Sub-Inspector in the ratio of 1:4 and after taking preference remove the already selected candidates as per clause 11.2. Further the applicants pray that Respondent No. 1, MPSC be directed to follow the recruitment process as per the procedure prescribed in Clause 11 of the Main Advertisement dated 15.9.2023 of Maharashtra Non-Gazetted Group-B Main Examination.



- 2. Learned counsel for the applicants submitted that opportunities were denied to the applicants as MPSC has not followed the procedure mentioned in Clause 11.1.2 and 11.2 of the said Advertisement. Learned counsel further submitted that while maintaining the ratio, they have failed to observe the procedure of preparing the General Merit List of all the candidates appearing for the post of Assistant Section Officer, State Tax Inspector, Sub-Registrar and P.S.I. Learned counsel further submitted that as per clause 11.2 of the Advertisement, it was necessary for the Respondent, MPSC to call for the preference within seven days from all the candidates, who have cleared the Main Examination. Learned counsel submitted that as MPSC has failed to do so, the opportunity of the applicants to get called for the interview is denied.
- 3. Learned counsel submitted that on 17.12.2024, out of 51 candidates present for physical test, 29 qualified. On 18.12.2024, out of 61 candidates, 29 qualified, on 19.12.2024, out of 65 candidates, 37 qualified and on 20.12.2024, out of 54 candidates 32 qualified. In all 127 candidates qualified.
- 4. Learned C.P.O on instructions submitted that 374 posts of P.S.I were advertised for which 1558 candidates were called. The candidates called are four times the number of posts advertised as per the procedure laid down by MPSC. Ms Manisha Khade, from MPSC informed that on 17.12.2024, 170 candidates were called and out of that 119 candidates were absent and 51 appeared for physical test. On 18.12.2024, 200 candidates were called and out of that 139 were absent and 61 appeared for physical test. On 19.11.2024 again 200 candidates were called and out of that 131 were absent and 69 were present. (Some were absent on account of medical extension). On 20.12.2024, out of 200 persons, 143

candidates were absent and 54 were present. Learned CPO submitted that thereafter 487 Women candidates are called for physical test.

- 5. Learned C.P.O further submitted that at the outset the applicants are not meritorious as they have got less marks than the cut-off marks in the Main Examination.
- 6. We have made query to the learned counsel for the applicants whether the applicants have given one choice, i.e., for PSI or they have given the choice for the post of Assistant Section Officer, Sub-Registrar, State Tax Inspector or P.S.I. Learned counsel for the applicants relied on the decision of this Tribunal dated 10.5.2024 in O.A 569/2024, R.B Zendage & Ors Vs. The State of Maharashtra & Ors.
- 7. On query, learned counsel for the applicants submitted that Applicant No. 1, S.D Patil from EWS category got 256.5 marks out of 400 marks and cut-off is 257 marks. Applicant No. 2, D.D Gunjal, from DT (Male) got 236 out of 400 marks and cut-off is 259 marks. Applicant No. 3, S.D Patil, from EWS (Male) got 254 out of 400 marks and cut-off is 257 marks. Applicant No. 4, D.N Jadhav from Open Male got 258 out of 400 marks, cut-off marks 266.5 marks.
- 8. In the order dated 10.5.2024 of this Tribunal in O.A 569/2024, we have laid down the procedure which is required to be followed under Rule 11.1 & 11.2. However, that procedure was laid down especially in respect of the posts of Sub-Registrar and State Tax Inspectors where the candidates were recommended for the said posts and cut of that the candidate was yet to be recommended for the post of Assistant Section Officer and thus by

following these observations MPSC has given the option and revised the Merit List.

- 9. In the present case, the names of the candidates for the post of PSI are not recommended and their physical tests are yet to be conducted. We are of the view that once common Entrance Test is conducted, we cannot disallow anybody to appear in any examination or test, if he clears the criteria of merit. In the present case the applicants have secured less marks.
- 10. We direct Respondent, MPSC to give the data of the candidates who have cleared the physical test and who are going to be called for interview.

ORDER

- 1. The issue involved in both the O.As is one and the same. Applicants, pursuant to the Advertisement No.24/2022 issued by the Respondent No.2 for the post of Administrative Officer challenge list dated 18.12.2024 for not including the name of the Applicants. Applicants pray that the Respondents be directed to hold and declare that the Applicants are eligible for the post of Administrative Officer, Group B (Public Health Department). Applicants further pray that Respondent No.1 be directed to allow the Applicants to appear for the interview which is scheduled on 26th and 27th December, 2024 for the post of Administrative Officer, Group B (Public Health Department) forthwith with all other consequential service benefits or stay the said process.
- 2. It is the case of the applicants that all the three of them possess experience of Supervisory work as mentioned in Clause 8.2 of the Advertisement. They have Supervisory experience comparable to the post of Superintendent or Head Clerk in the under Government or under Local



Authority or Commercial Establishment or Corporation or Board Established by Government. However, by the impugned communication their names are mentioned in the list of ineligible candidates. The candidature of all the three candidates is rejected on the ground that they do not possess requisite experience or comparable experience of Supervisory work. Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 has been working as Supervisor in Agricultural Produce Market Committee (APMC) having experience of more than seven years and six months. He has produced the list of the functions of his work and also list of the work of the post of Superintendent in Public Health Department and has submitted that these functions are same and therefore Applicant is to be declared as having equivalent experience. Similar is the case of the Applicants in O.A.No.1622/2024. Both the Applicants in O.A.No.1622/2024 are working as Accountant-cum Head Clerk in the office of Public Health Department in the pay scale of S-13 and they should not have been considered as ineligible.

- 3. Learned Counsel press for interim relief. It is pointed out by learned Counsel that the pay scale of the applicants and as mentioned in the Advertisement is one and the same i.e. S-15 (Rs.41800-132300). Learned Counsel for the Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 has relied on Clause 8.2 of the Advertisement and has submitted that the applicants satisfy the criteria mentioned in the said Clause.
- 4. Learned Counsel for the Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 has submitted that some of the candidates who were shown as eligible are given time to produce their certificates showing Supervisory Experience and it is pleaded that if, those candidates are allowed to appear for the interview on condition of producing eligibility certificate and same opportunity is denied to the applicant, then it is against the Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India. Therefore the Applicant by way of parity is to be allowed to appear for the interview. Applicants have placed on record the documents which are *pari materia* to the duties and the functions carried out by the Superintendent, Public Health Department. It is pointed out by learned Counsel that the pay scale of the applicants and as mentioned in the Advertisement is one and the same i.e. S-13 (Rs.35400-112400).
- 5. Learned P.O. has submitted that Respondent, M.P.S.C. has made query on the point of experience on Supervisory Post and how it can be compared



with others. The Under Secretary, State of Maharashtra, Public Health Department by letter dated 31.01.2024 has informed M.P.S.C. that the Pay Scale of S-14 (GP Rs.4300/-) and Pay Scale of S-13 (GP Rs.4200/- is to be considered as valid and comparable and not others as the post of Administrative Officer falls in the Pay Scale of S-15 (Rs.41800-132300). Learned P.O. has submitted that while considering the suitability and eligibility the experts have taken into account the nature of duties of each candidate which is previously held by them and if the nature of duties is found similar then only those candidates are called for interview which is going to be conducted on 26th or 27th December, 2024. Learned P.O. has produced the report of the Committee in respect of Applicant No.1, Applicant No.1, Mr. Pranay Mohan Sankhe in O.A.No.1622/2024 (copy is taken on record and marked as Exhibit-I). In respect of Applicant No.2, Ms. Sujata Shrikant Gaikwad in O.A.No.1622/2024 (copy is taken on record and marked as Exhibit-II). It is found that Applicants No.1 and 2 in O.A.No.1622/2024 are not found eligible. In respect of Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024, learned P.O. has submitted that the work of Supervisor in APMC is Supervisory work and it is contemplated for the post of Administrative Officer in Public Health Department. The duty performed by the Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 is totally different that of Administrative Officer.

- 6. Clause 8.2 which is relied by learned Counsel for the Applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 reads as below:
 - "8.2: Possess degree of statutory University or a qualification recognized by Government as equivalent thereto, AND should be in a supervisory capacity in a post comparable to that of Superintendent or Head Clerk under Government or under Local Authority or Commercial Establishment or Corporation or Board Established by Government."

These are the reports submitted by the M.P.S.C. We call upon M.P.S.C. to produce the reports from the experts along with their affidavits from the Public Health Department to find out the suitability of the person for the post of Administrative Officer. Learned P.O. on instructions from Respondent M.P.S.C. has submitted that total 365 candidates have cleared the scrutiny process for 73 posts. Out of them M.P.S.C. has declared 246 candidates as not eligible. Thus, only 122 candidates are found eligible.

- 7. We make it clear that as we are sitting in the judicial review we cannot look into the facts of the matters. At this stage, we cannot grant any interim relief as within the powers of judicial review we cannot look into the facts and go on comparing the Supervisory duties of Superintendent or Head Clerk and Supervisory duties performed by the Applicants. The eligibility list which is produced before us does show some of the candidates are given time to produce their certificates showing the Supervisory Experience. We are not experts to know the abilities required for the post of Administrative Officer in Agricultural Produce Market Committee or Public Health Department.
- 8. No injunction order can be passed at his stage. The duties which are shown as performed by applicant in O.A.No.1620/2024 are list of duties on a piece of paper. We call upon Respondent, M.P.S.C. to submit their say on the next date. However, we are, prima facie, of view that if they do not fulfill the criteria of the experience then they cannot be given time. If, at all M.P.S.C. has committed wrong calling some eligible candidates for interview on conditional basis then it may be incorrectly, however, there cannot be a parity for wrong. There can be parity for legal and correct things. At present considering the submissions of both the parties, no case is made out to grant interim relief.
- 9. The office objections, if any, are to be removed and court fees to be paid, if not already paid.
- 10. Issue notice before admission returnable on 13.01.2025.
- 11. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondent intimation/notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A. Private service is allowed. Respondents are put to notice that the case may be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 12. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 13. By Hand delivery, speed post, courier notice to be served and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.



- 14. In case notice is not collected within seven days or service report on affidavit is not filed three days before returnable date, the Original Application shall be placed on board before the concerned Bench under the caption "for Dismissal" and thereafter on the subsequent date the Original Application shall stand dismissed.

- Ld. Advocate for the applicant by way of interim relief prays for staying the implementation of the impugned order dated 23.10.2024 passed by respondent no.1 by which the financial and administrative powers of the applicant are withdrawn.
- Ld. Advocate for the applicant submits that Government has no power to issue such orders withdrawing the financial and administrative powers of the applicant. Further it is a drastic and stigmatic order totally vague issued without giving show cause notice.
- The impugned order is dated 23.10.2024 issued by the respondent no.1 to respondent no.2. On the same day the respondent no.2 issued office order based on the above order. On 23.10.2024 there is memo issued by Dy. Director, Technical Education, Pune to the applicant. This memo was replied by the applicant vide his email dated 30.10.2024. Meanwhile on 29.10.2024 the applicant has made representation against the impugned order addressed to the Hon'ble Governor, Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary, Government of Maharashtra, Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Minister, Higher & Technical Education and copy of the same is marked for information and necessary action to Dy. Director, Technical Education.
- Ld. Advocate for the applicant submits that whatever are the contents of the impugned order they need to be substantiated by the departmental proceedings etc. He submits that since he is supposed to undertake teaching duties only for six hours per week, he will be sitting without any work if the financial and administrative powers are withdrawn. Hence, he prays for interim relief.
- Ld. PO submits that the impugned order has already been executed and it is more than one and half months after which the

applicant has filed this OA on 17.12.2024. At this stage there is no requirement of granting interim relief. If any interim relief is granted at this stage, it would amount to granting final order. Ld. PO contends that the impugned order is not by way of punishment but only certain powers have been withdrawn. Ld. PO states that department is going to initiate DE against the applicant. Since the applicant was acting in an arbitrary manner harming the interest of number of subordinates the Government thought it fit to withdraw his powers and initiate DE. Ld. PO submits that proper procedure has been followed while issuing the impugned order. Ld. PO further submits that notice may be issued and she may be granted time to file reply.

- 7. Ld. PO is directed to procure letter dated 21.10.2024 under reference in the impugned order. Further Ld. PO is directed to seek clear time line about the DE etc.

- 2. Shri M.D. Lonkar, Ld. Special Counsel for the respondents has raised preliminary objection at the outset questioning the maintainability of the OA since remedies available to the applicant have not been exhausted before approaching this Tribunal. He submits that this objection will be met by the respondents in their reply after which the Court may decide about the maintainability of the OA.
- 3. Ld.-Advocate for the applicant tenders a copy of judgment and order dated 21.11.2023 passed by this Tribunal in OA No.989/2023 Smt. Vinaya D. Badami Vs. The State of Maharashtra & Ors. on the point of maintainability or otherwise of the OA. Ld. Advocate for the applicant prays for interim relief in respect of suspension order dated 11.12.2024. He states that the applicant had earlier filed OA No.1475/2023 by which transfer order dated 22.11.2023 of the applicant was challenged. This Tribunal by its order dated 23.11.2023 has stayed the transfer order and the said OA is pending. The applicant came to be posted at Panvel on 29.7.2021 and has been continued till suspension order came up as transfer order was stayed by this Tribunal.
- 4. Ld. Advocate for the applicant states that para 1 of the impugned order speaks about Govt. memo dated 4.3.2024 about DE in progress under Rule 8 of MCS (Discipline & Appeal) Rules, 1979. If the Govt. desire to suspend the applicant on this ground then the applicant should have been suspended at that time only.
- 5. Ld. Advocate for the applicant states that impugned order of suspension is issued without competence and the order is non-est. The charges mentioned in para 2 of the impugned order is also utter falsity, baseless and devoid of any documentary

evidence. However, even if it is considered for the sake of argument that there was irregularity on the part of the applicant in spending money in excess, the applicant's explanation has not been called. So the charges of alleged misconduct in para 2 of the impugned order is not a misconduct at all. Hence, Ld. Advocate for the applicant submits that the order of suspension is malafide, irrational leading to misuse of powers. Moreover, the impugned order is actually to settle scores with the applicant who had approached this Tribunal against her transfer order and got stay to the same earlier.
