- 1. Heard Shri D.B Khaire, learned advocate for the Applicant and Smt Kranti S.G aikwad, learned Presenting Officer for the Respondents.
- 2. In the present Original Application, challenge is to the impugned transfer order dated 10.12.2018, whereby in place of the applicant, Respondent no. 3 Shri Adinath L. Dagade has been posted as Deputy Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Thane Taluka. Significantly no consequential posting order of the applicant has been issued.
- 3. The applicant has challenged the impugned transfer order on the ground that it is mid-term and in contravention of provisions of Section 4(4)(ii) & 4(5) of ROT Act, 2005.
- 4. On the above background, learned advocate for the applicant seek interim stay to the transfer order dated 10.12.2018.
- 5. Learned Presenting Officer Smt Kranti S. Gaikwad, has produced the file containing the minutes of the Civil Services Board and approval of the Hon'ble Chief Minister

many

- 6. Interesting to note that Respondent no. 3, Shri Adinath L. Dagade has been proposed to be posted at Jalgaon as per minutes of the Civil Services Board. However, Hon'ble Chief Minister approved the proposal for posting Respondent no. 3 Shri Adinath L. Dagade as Deputy Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Thane Taluka (in place of applicant).
- 7. As such though the recommendation of Civil Services Board was for posting of Respondent no. 3 at Jalgaon, Hon'ble Chief Minister directed for his posting at Thane by displacing the applicant.
- 8. No consequential posting order in respect of the applicant has been issued and he has been kept in abeyance. This being a mid-term transfer, there has to be compliance of provisions of Sec 4(4)(ii) of the ROT Act, 2005. There has to be special case for such mid-term transfer and reasons are required to be recorded.
- 9. However, in the present case, there is absolutely no compliance of recording confirms of reasons. Prima facie, the impugned transfer order has been issued only to accommodate Respondent no. 3, who was waiting for posting for more than 2 months. As such prima facie there is contravention of Section 4(4)(ii) & 4(5) of ROT Act, 2005.
- 10. In view of the above, I am satisfied that it is fit case to grant interim relief to stay the execution and implementation of the impugned transfer order dated 10.12.2018 and status quo ante is granted.
- 11. Accordingly, interim relief in terms of prayer 11(a) is granted till filing of reply.
- 12. Issue notice returnable on 18.1.2019.
- 13. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal need not be issued.

- 15. This intimation/notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 1988, and the questions such as limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.
- 16. The service may be done by hand delivery/ speed post/courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the Registry within one week. Applicants are directed to file affidavit of compliance and notice.

- 17. In case notice is not collected within 3 days or service report on affidavit is not filed 3 days before returnable date, Original Application shall stand dismissed without reference and papers be consigned to record.
