2. Learned counsel for the applicants submits that the applicants were appointed as Muster Assistant in the year 1985, 1984 & 1984 respectively under the Employment Guarantee Scheme (EGS). However, as working on EGS, their services were retrenched from 01.08.1986, 01.01.1986 and 01.05.1989 respectively. applicants have approached the Labour Court, Ahmednagar for reinstatement with continuity in service and back wages, the learned Presiding Officer, Labour Court, Ahmednagar passed award in

their favour and directed respondent No. 3 to reinstate the applicants with continuity of service, but without back wages. Accordingly, the applicants came to be reinstated as Muster Assistant by respondent No. 3 in his office. However respondent No. 3 meanwhile challenged the Award passed by the Labour Court before the Hon'ble High Court by filing W.P. Nos. 4619/2000, 4614/2000 & 4615/2000 respectively and by judgment and order dated 08.09.2001, the Hon'ble High Court was pleaded to set aside the Award passed by the Labour Court, however in para No. 25, it is observed that undisputedly the seniority is required to be maintained in relation to the Muster Assistants by the Tahsildar.

3. Learned counsel for the applicants pointed out para No. 8 from the affidavit in reply filed on behalf of respondent Nos. 1 to 3, wherein it is specifically stated that it is for the Tahsildar to maintain seniority and recommendations are to be made on availability of work. However, due to non-availability of work, the Tahsildar has not recommended the complainants name for appointment and therefore, the complainants were not re-appointed.

- 4. In view of above, learned counsel for the applicants submits that under such circumstances, the Collector, Ahmednagar is necessary party for just decision of the present Original Applications.
- 5. Learned Presenting Officer has not raised any serious objection for the same.
- 6. In view of above, the Collector, Ahmednagar be added as party respondent to the present O.As. and the applicants shall carry out the necessary amendment forthwith.
- 7. Issue notice to newly added respondent in all these O.As., returnable on 20.03.2024.

No case is made out by the applicant for condonation of delay. There is no substance in the application and the application is liable to be rejected.
- 7. The applicant is retired employee serving as a Forest Guard at the time of his retirement on attaining the age of superannuation on 30.06.2016. He was Class-III employee at the time of his

6. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that it is merely stated in the reply that the applicant has not approached to respondent No.2 within time. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is from Scheduled Caste and as such he is entitled for the benefit of Lad-Page Committee recommendations for appointment on compassionate ground on voluntary retirement opted by his grandfather who was working as Ward Servant (Kaksh Sevak) in Government Medical College & Hospital, Aurangabad. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that there is no inaction on the part of the applicant and the application is thus deserves to be allowed.

- 7. Learned P.O. has strongly resisted the application on the ground that there is huge delay for which no satisfactory explanation has been tendered. Learned P.O. submits that the applicant has approached the authorities belatedly. grandfather of the applicant was retired in the year 2001 and the applicant has approached to the department belatedly for the benefit of Lad-Page Committee appointment on compassionate for ground. Learned P.O. submits that no case is made out for condonation of delay. There is totally inaction on the part of the applicant and the application thus liable to be rejected.
- 8. It appears that the grandfather of the applicant voluntarily retired from the service in the year 2001 but at that time the applicant who born on 18.12.1989 was minor and he has attained the age of majority on 18.12.2007. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is still working on daily wages at Kolhi Plantation and he is on the verge of retirement. applicant submitted Though the has the representation even in the year 2022, the same has not been considered. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant comes from poor strata of society and has no means for survival except the meager amount of daily wages. The applicant could not approach the Tribunal within time due to his financial poor condition. There is no inaction on the part of the applicant and there is no intentional and deliberate delay in filing the accompanying O.A. The application thus deserves to be allowed.
- 6. Learned Presenting Officer strongly resisted the application on the ground that there is huge delay of 6 years 9 months and 19 days for which the applicant has not tendered the satisfactory explanation.

- 7. Learned P.O. submits that in those years the applicant has not completed 240 days continuously for 5 years since he had worked as delay wager under Employment Guarantee Scheme. There is no substance in the Misc. Application and the same is liable to be rejected.
- 8. At this stage, there is no need to go into the merits. However, it appears that the respondent has not considered the case of the applicant in its proper perspectives. The applicant is still working as a Van Majoor since from the date of appointment i.e. 01.11.1986. The applicant is poor person and except the meager amount of daily wages, he has no other means for survival. It appears that he could not approach this Tribunal within stipulated period due to poor financial condition.
- 9. In view of above, I am inclined to condone the delay caused in filing the accompanying Original. However, the applicant is required to be saddled with costs. I compute the costs of Rs.200/- (Two Hundred only)

on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER

The Misc. Application No. 203/2023 is allowed in following terms:-

- The delay of 6 years, 9 months and 19 (A) days caused in filing the accompanying O.A. under Section 19 of the Administrative Tribunals 1985 is hereby condoned subject Act, costs of Rs. 200/to (Two Hundred only). The amount of costs shall be deposited the Registry of this Tribunal within a period of one month from the date of this order.
- (B) Upon satisfaction of the costs as above, the accompanying O.A. be registered and numbered by taking in to account other office objection/s, if any.
