Learned counsel for the applicant submits that by filing the accompanying Original Application the applicant is seeking direction that the impugned communication dated 16.11.2018 issued by the respondent No.1 thereby rejecting the application filed by the applicant seeking compassionate appointment on the ground of delay in filing such application be quashed and set aside and further seeking direction to consider the name of the applicant for compassionate appointment.

- 4. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the father of the applicant who was Government servant died in harness in the year 1995. The mother of the applicant namely Sonabai had applied for grant of compassionate appointment and her name was also included in the waiting list. However she could not get the appointment on compassionate ground on account of attaining the age of 40 years. Ultimately she expired on 08.04.2007, when the applicant was 16 years old. The applicant has one younger brother and five elder sisters. The sisters were married during the life time of his father and mother respectively.
- 5. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that even after the death of mother, the department has not given understanding to the applicant that after attaining the age of majority, he can file an application for compassionate appointment. The applicant had initially approached to Lokayukta for the purpose of compassionate appointment so also

the family pension. However, to the extent of family pension, the Lokayukta has made the observation in favour of the applicant and so far the compassionate appointment is concerned, the Lokayukta has observed that it is for the department to consider the same in terms of the appropriate G.Rs. Learned counsel submits that though there is long delay in getting appointment compassionate ground after the death of father, however, the applicant who is 30 years of age is in private service and his brother is still taking education and working on daily wages.

6. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the delay caused in approaching this Tribunal is for want of legal knowledge about the remedy available before this Tribunal. Further during the period of 2020 to 2022 there was outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic in the entire country and therefore, the applicant could not avail legal remedy. Consequently, there is a delay in approaching this Tribunal and the same is not intentional or deliberate one.

- 7. Learned counsel Shri S.B. Patil representing the respondent No.3 has strongly resisted the application on the ground that the applicant has knowledge to approach before Lokayukta for redressal of his grievances and in view of same, it is difficult to believe that he was not knowing about remedy available before this Tribunal. Learned counsel for the respondent No.3 submits that the applicant has not bothered to inform the department about the death of his mother. Learned counsel for the respondent No.3 submits that the applicant has slept over his right, for years together and in view of same, there is an inordinate and deliberate delay in approaching this Tribunal. There is no substance in the Misc. Application and the same is liable to be rejected.
- 8. Learned counsel for respondent No. 3 has placed his reliance on the judgment and order passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Special leave to Appeal (C) No. (s). 20773/2019. However, the same may be helpful to the learned counsel for

respondent No.3 in the Original Application, if the delay is condoned.

- 9. Learned Presenting Officer has also resisted the application on the similar grounds as raised by the learned counsel for respondent No.3 and submits that there is no substance in the application and the same is liable to be rejected.
- 10. This pertains to compassionate appointment. Even though after the death of father of the applicant in the year 1995 in harness, the name of mother of the applicant was included in waiting list, however, for years together the mother of applicant could not get appointment and her name was removed from waiting list on attaining the age of 40 Ultimately the mother of applicant also died in the year 2007 when the applicant was 16 years of Further the department has not given age. understanding to the applicant and his family their members about entitlement to seek compassionate appointment on attaining the age of majority. Furthermore, due to Covid-19 pandemic outbreak and declaration of lockdown by the Government from time to time, the applicant could

not take effective steps. However, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in **Suo Motu Writ Petition**(C) No. 3 of 2020 has considered the outbreak of the pandemic Covid-19 and further lockdown announced in the Country and extension of the lockdown period continued upto the year 2021 and thus directed that the delay if any caused in approaching the Courts/Tribunals or any other forum required to be considered from the date as specified in the said order.

11. In view of above, in my considered opinion, there is no intentional or deliberate delay in approaching this Tribunal. The applicant has prevented from sufficient cause to approach this Tribunal in time. I am thus inclined to condone the delay subject to costs. I compute the costs of Rs. 1,000/- (One Thousand only) on the applicant and proceed to pass the following order: -

ORDER

2. When the present matter is taken up for consideration, learned counsel appearing applicant pointed out that during pendency of the present Original Application the applicant has preferred the representation with the respondent authorities seeking correction in the dates which are incorrectly mentioned in the order of termination of the probation period. It is not in dispute that the Original Application has been filed by the applicant seeking direction against the respondents to take decision for terminating his probation period. It is also not in dispute that during pendency of the present Original Application the order came to be passed on 11.10.2018 and thereby the probation period of the applicant has been terminated. Learned counsel has brought to our notice that the date of appointment has been incorrectly mentioned in the said order and now his endavour is to get corrected that

order for which he has made representation. It appears that the authorities did not decide the representation because of pendency of the present Original Application. In the circumstances, we deem it appropriate to dispose of the present Original Application, without going into the merits of the contention raised therein, by directing respondent No. 1 to decide the representation dated 20.02.2019 submitted by the applicant within the period of 12 weeks from the date of this order. Order accordingly.

3. Needless to state that even thereafter any dispute subsists, the applicant is not precluded from approaching the Tribunal. There shall be no order as to costs.

2. When the present matter is taken up for consideration, learned Chief Presenting Officer submitted that in the selection process which was carried out, the candidate who was selected since was having criminal case pending against him was not selected. Learned C.P.O. further submits that the present applicant who was at Sr. No. 1 in waiting list approached this Tribunal and impugned order has been passed by this Tribunal directing the respondents to appoint him on the post of Learned C.P.O. further submits that in the meanwhile period the applicant, who was selected but was not appointed was acquitted from the criminal case and hence, approached the Government claiming according his selection appointment to in the recruitment process. Learned C.P.O. submits that in the circumstances, the order passed by this Tribunal has not

been complied with and the respondents have decided to approach the Hon'ble High Court by filing Writ Petition. It is further contended that within few days writ petition will be filed.

- 3. Learned counsel appearing for the contempt petitioner has strongly opposed for adjourning the present matter on the aforesaid ground stating that unless there is some order from the Hon'ble High Court, the contempt of the order of this Tribunal continues. It is further contended that sufficient time has elapsed for taking further action by the respondents, which was not taken by them. Learned counsel appearing for the applicant prayed for issuing notice of contempt in the prescribed format to the respondents.
- 4. We have duly considered the submissions made by the parties. In the instant case it does not appear to us that the respondents are deliberately avoiding to comply the order passed by this Tribunal. In the circumstances, the reasons which are explained by the learned Chief Presenting Officer the respondents have decided to approach the Hon'ble High Court, it appears to us that in such matters reasonable opportunity needs
