Heard Shri A.D. Bhawsar, the applicant in person and Shri P.N. Warjurkar, Id. counsel for the respondents.

The compliance of the order dated 24-1-2014 passed in O.A. 612/2013 was sought. The applicant and Id. P.O. submitted on 11-2-2016 that the revised detailed proposal of the pension case is already sent to the A.G. on 12-1-2016. However, the grievance of the applicant is that the pension is to be fixed considering the service period after absorption. The A.G. has issued the communication dated 10-3-2016 (P-70) which mentions that the pension of the applicant can be fixed as per rule 67 (a) of The Maharashtra Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1982 (in short 'Pension Rules') and as per that rule the period of service upto absorption is only to be considered as qualifying service. From the language implied in the rule 67 of the Pension Rules we do not find any fault in the letter issued by the A.G. When the pension case is sent to the A.G. now the compliance has become a formality. As such, the grievance of the applicant stands redressed. Consequently, the C.A. in contempt petition stands disposed of.
