- "शासन निर्णय दिनांक २७/१०/२००९ अन्वये पदवीधर/ पदविकाधारक अंशकालीन उमेदवारांना शासकीय / निमशासकीय सेवेतील महाराष्ट्र लोकसेवा आयोगाच्या कक्षेबाहेरील गट 'क' पदावरील सरळ सेवेने करावयाच्या नियुक्त्यांसाठी १० टक्के समांतर आरक्षण लागू करण्यात आले आहे. सदर समांतर आरक्षण हे जाहिरातीत दर्शविण्यात आलेल्या पदांनुसार राहील. सदरचे आरक्षण हे समांतर आरक्षण असल्यामुळे पदवीधर/ पदिवकाधारक अंशकालीन उमेदवारांकरिता आरिक्षत असलेल्या पदांचा अनुशेष पुढे ओढणे आवश्यक नाही. या घटकाकरिता जाहिरातीत दर्शविलेल्या आरिक्षत पदांसाठी पात्र उमेदवार उपलब्ध न झाल्यास ती पदे गुणवत्तेनुसार उपलब्ध अन्य पात्र उमेदवारांमधून दिनांक १६/०३/१९९९ च्या शासन परिपत्रकातील तरतूदीनूसार विहित केलेल्या कार्यपध्दतीचा अवलंब करुन भरण्यात यावीत. "
- 4. Thereafter, the Hon'ble Bombay High Court, Bench at Aurangabad in the case of *Nikhil Santosh Chaudhari Vs. State of Maharahstra* and others held that if the ex-serviceman or part time candidate not available from the same vertical reservation category, candidate on merit

should be taken. This was also observed in order of this Tribunal dated 7/2/2023.

- 5. The issue is very clear that if exserviceman candidate is not available the respondents should take the candidate from the same vertical category on the basis of merit. The learned counsel for the applicant submitted that the applicant is at waiting list no.1, therefore, there is no reason to deny appointment to the applicant, as the candidate from ex-serviceman is not available and if vacancy is there.
- 6. The learned P.O. seeks two weeks time to file reply. Time is granted as a last chance. It is made clear that if the reply is not filed till the next date, the matter will be decided on merit.

- 2. The issue is regarding publication of the marks of the candidates by the MPSC. The learned counsel for the applicants has made party as respondent no.4, Secretary of the MPSC. Even till today compliance has not been done regarding awarding marks list of the candidates who have been recommended for appointment for deciding the seniority of the candidates.
- 3. The learned counsel for the applicants has pointed out the letter of MPSC dated 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2020 (P-46 & 47) of the C.P. As per page no.47, six candidates including the some applicants have been recommended for appointment as a special case. Only grievance of the applicants is that their marks have not been communicated along with the other selected candidates due to which seniority of the applicants cannot be fixed.
- 4. In view of above, first the MPSC is directed to provide list of selected candidates along with

their marks including the applicants. If it is not done, the respondent no.4 is directed to personally appear or depute some responsible Officer before this Tribunal on the next date for clarifying what is the problem for not providing the list of selected candidates along with their marks.

- 2. The learned counsel for the applicant has filed the Review Application for review of the order dated 03/01/2020 passed in 0.A.No.84/2019.
- 3. The learned counsel for the applicant has pointed out that the applicant is aggrieved with the portion of order dated 24/05/2018 in which it is mentioned that "परंतु प्रत्यक्ष थकबाकी ही त्यांच्या नियत वयोमान सेवानिवृत्तीच्या तारखेच्या लगत पूर्वीच्या तीन वर्षाच्या कालावधीपुरती मर्यादित राहील."

- "7. The respondents in their reply para-3, page no.34 have mentioned provisions of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Joining time, Foreign Services and Payment during Suspension, Dismissal and Removal) Rules,1981 in Rule 70 (4) (page no.46) which is re-produced below –

- "Provided that any payment under this sub-rule to a Government servant (other than a Government servant who is governed by the provisions of the Payment of Wages Act, 1936 (4 of 1936) shall be restricted to a period of three years immediately preceding the date on which orders for reinstatement of such Government servant are passed by the appellate authority or reviewing authority, or immediately preceding the date of retirement on superannuation of such Government Servant, as the case may be"
- 5. Today, during course of hearing the learned counsel for the applicant has pointed out the Rule 70 (2) of the Maharashtra Civil Services (Joining time, Foreign Service and Payments During Suspension, Dismissal and Removal) Rules, 1981.
