- 2. At the request of ld. counsel for the applicant, issue fresh notice to R-2, returnable in <u>four weeks</u>. Hamdast allowed.
- 3. Tribunal may take the case for final disposal at this stage and separate notice for final disposal shall not be issued.
- 4. Applicant is authorized and directed to serve on Respondents intimation / notice of date of hearing duly authenticated by Registry, along with complete paper book of O.A. Respondent is put to notice that the case would be taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission hearing.
- 5. This intimation / notice is ordered under Rule 11 of the Maharashtra Administrative Tribunal (Procedure) Rules,1988, and the questions such as

limitation and alternate remedy are kept open.

6. The service may be done by Hand delivery, speed post, courier and acknowledgement be obtained and produced along with affidavit of compliance in the

Registry within one week. Applicant is directed to file Affidavit of compliance and notice.

- 2. In several cases the observations are made by the Tribunal about the administrative working in the Health Department of the Govt. of Maharashtra.
- 3. This is a classic example even the Medical Officer is how suffered on that count.
- 4. The applicant working as a Medical Officer (Group-B) was posted at Open Jail, Morshi (Dist. Amravati). Due to ill-health he submitted the application on 12-10-2012 (A-2,P-17) that he is

unable to work as his lungs have become very weak and he cannot do the work. On the same day, the applicant sent the communication to the Jt. Director of Health Department, Pune (A-3,P-18). The applicant wrote a letter directly to the Additional Chief Secretary, Public Health Department, Mumbai on 22-03-2013 (A-4,P-19). In all this correspondence, the applicant has stated about his physical condition with a mention that he is unable to work.

5. On 15-06-2013 (A-5,P-20) the Jt. Director of Health Department, Pune directed the Civil Surgeon, Amravati for medical examination of the applicant. The applicant appeared before the Medical Board. The Medical Board issued the Certificate dated 01-08-2013 (A-6, P-22) that he is permanently unfit for duty. All this consumed a year.

- 6. Thereafter, for the first time after a gap of about 1½ years the department has woke from the deep slumber and had passed the order regarding the absence of the applicant from 05-10-2012 to 01-08-2013 granting different kinds of leave. Thereafter again the matter was in cold storage. As a last recourse the applicant has knocked at the doors of the Tribunal.
- 7. The apathy of department does not end there. The O.A. is filed on 22-8-2016 and after service, the matter was adjourned thrice giving three months time and on the last date it was observed that if the reply is not filed, the heavy cost will be saddled but again the order fell on the deaf ears of the Health Department. The applicant has also prayed for terminal benefits. The learned counsel for the applicant has prayed for the cost. From the above observations it is crystal

clear that in all respects it is fit case to grant even the compensatory cost. But, the compensatory costs are not prayed. The Tribunal had occasion to observe lack of administration Health in Department and hence copies of orders are sent to Chief Secretary to corrective measures but to no effect. As such the applicant can be entitled for the costs of this proceeding quantified are to Rs.5,000/- to be paid to applicant by respondent nos. 1&2.

8. In the above state of affairs now considering the pathetic plight of the applicant undergoing for half decade who is none else but the Medical Officer colleague of Respt. No.2 serving in the department and considering the nature of reliefs claimed the O.A. has to be disposed of with a direction. Consequently, the O.A. is disposed of with the following terms:-

- (i) The respondent nos. 1&2 to decide the applicant's application dated 12-10-2012 on or before 10th February, 2017 according to law.
- (ii) The terminal benefits of the applicant be disbursed before 31-03-2017.
- (iii) The R-1&2 to pay the cost of the proceeding of Rs.5,000/- to the applicant alongwith terminal benefits.
- (iv) With this, the O.A. stands disposed of.
- (v) The Registrar and Id. P.O. to send the copy of this order to the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Maharashtra.
