Despite of this, it is mentioned in the Govt. order dated 9-12-2016 that the transfer order is withdrawn as per the order passed by this Tribunal. He also submits that R/3 is transferred in place of the applicant and therefore his rights are affected.

3. Learned P.O. submits that he has no instructions. Anyhow fact remains that no order is passed by this Tribunal, but the Govt. order stipulates that the Tribunal has passed the order and therefore second order is issued which

requires consideration. As such, learned P.O. to clarify in this regard.

2. The applicant has filed the O.A. seeking promotion from

the post of Jailor, Group-I to the post of Superintendent, District Prison Class-II/Deputy Superintendent Central Prison.

3. The O.A. is filed on 6/9/2016. The Respondent has filed the reply on No. 2 18/11/2016. The said reply is adopted by R/1. It is a Division Bench matter. The Id. P.O. has taken objection to decided it by the Single Bench. The Id. Counsel for the applicant prayed for interim relief.

4. The ld. Counsel for the applicant submitted that he is to retire on 31/12/2016. The applicant has challenged the order dtd. 15/2/2016 (Annex.A-1, page-13) by which R/3 is promoted.

The grievance of the applicant is **R/3** is junior to the that but promoted. He relied on the seniority list (page-34) as on 1/1/2014 wherein the applicant is at Sr. No. 5 and R/3 is at Sr. No.12. The reply of the P.O. is that the seniority list is temporary and not final and the applicant is not given the promotion because he has not cleared the departmental examination within the time limit.

5. The Id. P.O. submits that as per Rule No.2 and 3 of the Maharashtra Prison Department (Executive Officers Qualifying Examination) Rules 1977 (Page-46) dtd. 20/8/1977, the Executive Officer working in the cadre of Jailor, Group-I or Group-II if appointed directly has to clear the

departmental qualifying examination within 3 years from the date of his appointment and within 3 chances. By way of reply, the ld. Counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is a promotee and not a direct recruit and therefore these Rules are not applicable. The ld. P.O. relied on Rule 3(2) and submitted that the applicant is governed under the said Rules. The Rules 2 and 3 reproduced as under :-

2. "In these rules, unless the context requires otherwise

- (a) "Examination" means the Departmental Examination prescribed under these rules;
- (b) "Prison Department" means the Prison Department of the Government of Maharashtra ;

- (c) "Inspector General" means the Inspector General of Prisons;
- (d) "Executive Officer" means a person working in the cadre of Jailors (Group-I) or (Group-II) and in the cadre of the Superintendent of District Persons Class-II,
- **Every person appointed** 3. (1) directly to any post in the cadres of Jailors Group I or Group II or in the cadre of **Superintendents** of **District** Prisons. Class Ш after of these commencement rules, shall be required to Examination the in pass accordance with these rules within a period of five years from the date of his appointment and within three chances.

A candidate from (1) Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Denotified Tribes and

Nomadic Tribes, shall be given one more chance and one more year to pass the examination.

- Every person working in (2) any post in the cadre of Group-I Jailors, or Group-II or in the cadre of Supdts. of District Prisons Class-II on the date of commencement of these rules, shall, be required to pass the examination within three years and within three chances.
- (3) Save otherwise as provided in sub-rule(6), no Executive Officer shall hereafter be promoted in regular vacancy in any higher cadre, unless he has the passed Examination.

- (4) An Executive Officer who does not pass the Examination within the period prescribed under sub-rules(1) and
 (2) above or within the period extended under rule 11 will loose his seniority to all these who have passed the Examination.
- (5) Subject to the loss of seniority under sub-rule
 (4) and Executive
 Officer shall be allowed to pass the Examination in any number of chances.

During the interim period, that is, the period from the of the commencement of date these rules to the date on which final the results of the examination under these rules are declared, promotion of the Executive Officers to any of the

higher cadres shall be made according seniority to and suitability of persons. However, persons so promoted shall have to pass the Examination under these within a period of three rules years and within 3 chances from the date of commencement of these rules failing which they shall be reverted."

The Id. P.O. submits 6. that Clause-3 is in the nature of residuary and covers all the cases. The submission is misconceived. That is applicable to the employees who are already in service before the date of commencement of that Act.

7. The ld. Counsel for the applicant submits that the objection of the respondents that the applicant is junior is not well

founded. This aspect whether he requires of the clearance examination or not can be well considered in a full fledged trial. It appears hard to hear that any category of the employees can be exempted from passing the departmental examination. At this stage, it cannot be said that the assumption of the respondents that the applicant has lost the by not clearing the seniority qualifying departmental examination cannot be thrown away easily.

8. The matter also does not end there. According to the applicant he is promoted to the post of Jailor, Group-I, that is admitted by the respondents in their reply. The applicant was

initially appointed as a Clerk, then worked as a Jailor Guard, then Group-II and now in Group-I.

The Id. Counsel for the 9. applicant urged that he was held eligible for promotion in the DPC dtd. 8/10/2014 (Page-26) but enquiry was going on against him. However, vide report dtd. 16/7/2016 (Annex.A-6, page-30) the applicant is exonerated and thus the hurdle in his way stands removed to get the promotion. lt urged that the other is also employees who had not cleared the qualifying departmental examination were promoted as agitated in para 6 (9) of the O.A. and therefore clearance of the examination is not necessary. However, the ld. P.O. argued that

the applicant is also claiming the deemed date and if he succeeds he can get the relief. The applicant has sought the promotion which relief is directory in nature. The aspect that R/3 is junior to the applicant is also not clear due to the non-clearance of the Examination by the applicant. The applicant has challenged the promotional order of R/3 based on the order dtd. 15/2/2016 which may affect his because he is the last rights person in the list to get promotion. This aspect can be considered in the full fledged trial only.

10. The applicant's case is cleared by the DPC. As such he can get the promotion. However, considering the aspect of

clearance of examination, whether the post is available or not and the orders are to be issued by the Govt. and the period left is only of two weeks and the matter is at the interim stage, and moreover the applicant can get the deemed date with retrospective effect on disposal of the O.A., it is better to dispose of the O.A. at an earliest the pleadings also as are completed. As to grant the interim relief as good as to decide the O.A. and grant the final relief which is rarely to be done and in the above factual aspect it will be befitting in the circumstances to consider all these aspects to be decided in its full fledged trial. Hence no interim relief is granted.
