2. The applicant approached this Tribunal challenging the order passed by the respondent no.2, the Sub Divisional Officer (SDO), Morshi suspending the applicant for the alleged misconduct.

3. Heard the learned counsel for the applicant. He has submitted that the applicant was suspended vide order dated 26/27-8-2021. Even after completion of 90 days, the charge sheet was not served. In view of the Judgment of Hon'ble Apex Court in case of <u>Ajay Kumar</u> <u>Choudhary Vs. Union of India (UOI) & Ors. in Civil Appeal No.1912/2015 (arising out of SLP</u> (C) No.31761/2013, decided on 16/02/2015, the suspension cannot be continued more than three months.

4. The learned counsel for the applicant has submitted that even after the charge sheet, the respondent / authority has not passed reasoned order for continuation of suspension. Hence, the suspension order dtd. 26/27-8-2021 is liable to be quashed and set aside.

5. Heard Shri H.K. Pande, Id. P.O. for the respondents. He has submitted that now the charge sheet is given to the applicant on 11/1/2022. The Enquiry Officer is appointed and enquiry is going on. There is no dispute that the charge sheet is given to the applicant after completion of 90 days. No reasoned order for continuation of suspension is passed by the respondent no.2.

6. As per the submission of learned counsel for the applicant, the enquiry is not going on, only Enquiry Officer is appointed.

7. Looking to the ground, it is clear that the respondent no.2 wrongly continued the suspension of applicant even after 90 days. Till date the enquiry is not completed. As per the guidelines given by the Hon'ble Apex Court, the enquiry is to be completed as early as possible and the employee

cannot be suspended for years together. In para-14, the Hon'ble Apex Court has given guidelines which is reproduced as below –

"14 We, therefore, direct that the currency of a Suspension Order should not extend beyond three months if within this period the Memorandum of Charges/Chargesheet is not served on the delinquent officer/employee; if the Memorandum of Charges/Chargesheet is served a reasoned order must be passed for the extension of the suspension. As in the case in hand, the Government is free to transfer the concerned person to any Department in any of its offices within or outside the State so as to sever any local or personal contact that he may have and which he may misuse for obstructing the investigation against him. The Government may also prohibit him from contacting any person, or handling records and documents till the stage of his having to prepare his defence. We think this will adequately safeguard the universally recognized principle of human dignity and the right to a speedy trial and shall also preserve the interest of the Government in the prosecution. We recognize that previous Constitution Benches have been reluctant to quash proceedings on the grounds of delay, and to set time limits to their duration. However, the imposition of a limit on the period of suspension has not been discussed in prior case law, and would not be contrary to the interests of justice. Furthermore, the direction of the Central Vigilance Commission that pending a criminal investigation departmental proceedings are to be held in abeyance stands superseded in view of the stand adopted by us."
