The learned counsel for the applicants has filed one letter which shows that as per the advertisement, the date for submitting application is from 14/09/2023 to 03/10/2023 and the examination fee is to be paid before 03/10/2023. Copy of letter is taken on record and marked Exh-X for identification.
- 3. There is no dispute that advertisement of earlier examination of the year 2019 was published and exercise of examination etc., were completed on 03/01/2020. The selection list / result was published on 03/01/2020. As per the advertisement, the select list / waiting list was to remain in force for a period of one year. That period is expired on 3-4/1/2021. The present O.A. is filed on 08/02/2022.
- 4. As per the submission of learned counsel for applicants, the applicants have passed the examination as per the Advertisement of the year 2019. The respondents have not published the waiting list. They were not shown in the wait list.
- 5. There is no dispute that the selection list was published and the posts were filled by the respondents except some posts. The applicant is now praying to stay the examination process which is to be started as per the new Advertisement dated 11/08/2023.
- 6. The learned counsel for applicants has pointed out the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of *R.S. Mittal Vs. Union of India, 1995 Supp (2) SCC,230*. He has pointed out relevant portion of para-10 of the Judgment which is reproduced as under
  - " It is no doubt correct that a person on the select panel has no vested right to be appointed to the post for which he has been selected. He has a right to be considered

for appointment. But at the same time, the appointing authority cannot ignore the select panel or decline to make the appointment on its whims. When a person has been selected by the Selection Board and there is a vacancy which can be offered to him, keeping in view his merit position, then, ordinarily, there is no justification to ignore him for appointment. There has to be a justifiable reason to decline to appoint a person who is on the select panel. In the present case, there has been a mere inaction on the part of the Government. No reason whatever, not to talk of a justifiable reason, was given as to why the appointments were not offered to the candidates expeditiously and in accordance with law. The appointment should have been offered to Mr. Murgad within a reasonable time of availability of the vacancy and thereafter to the next candidate. The Central Government's approach in this case was wholly unjustified."

- 7. It appears that it was the observations made by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, but in para-11 and 12 the decision is given. It appears that though the Hon'ble Supreme Court has observed that select / waiting list was to remain in force for one year, but it was held that "under the circumstances it would not be appropriate to issue any direction at this point of time in favour of the appellant who is at no.4 of the select panel."
- 8. It appears that the appellant in the cited Judgment was at sr.no.4 of the select list. He was not appointed. Even though the direction was not given by the Hon'ble Supreme Court to appoint him as the period of select /wait list was expired. Therefore, the cited Judgment is not applicable in the case in hand. Cited Judgment is not helpful to the applicants.
- 9. The present O.A. is filed on 08/02/2022. The result was declared on 3/1/2020. On the same day, the select list was published. The waiting list if would have been published, then period of select / waiting list should have been upto 3-4/1/2021. At this juncture, there is no any waiting list and it cannot be said that select / waiting list is in existence. The respondents have started the process of regular appointment as per the Advertisement dated 11/8/2023. Hence, the applicants cannot claim that they should be appointed as per the earlier examination held in the year 2019. The period of select / waiting list should have been expired on 3-4/1/2021. This O.A. is itself filed on 08/02/2022. When the present O.A. is filed,

that time the period of one year has already been expired and therefore direction cannot been given to the respondents to keep some vacant posts or appoint the applicants.

10. During the pendency of this O.A. the applicants have pointed out that the respondents are going to appoint / recruit 227 posts. The applicants are at liberty to compete in the examination as per the advertisement dated 11/08/2023. At this stage, stay cannot be granted to the process of examination as per the advertisement dated 11/8/2023. Hence, the C.A. is dismissed. No order as to costs.
