After hearing, the learned P.O. may be referred the matter to Pay Verification Unit to verify the pay of applicant as per Govt. Notification of Finance dated 30/1/2019 (A-13,P-72).
- 5. The learned counsel has filed rejoinder to the reply filed by R-3 and on page no.61 in para-4 he has mentioned names of about 22 persons who are juniors to the applicant, but drawing more pay.
